

**FINAL AGENDA AND MINUTES

Mayor Wodraska called the meeting to order at 6:32 P.M.

Roll Call: Mayor Todd R. Wodraska; Vice-Mayor Ilan G. Kaufer; Councilor Ron Delaney; Councilor Jim Kuretski; Councilor Wayne R. Posner; Town Manager Andrew D. Lukasik and Town Clerk Sally M. Boylan.

1. Strategic Initiative Intentions and Definitions.

Mr. Andy Lukasik, Town Manager, stated the purpose of the meeting was to outline the Strategic Initiatives.

Ms. Trina Pulliam, with Trainnovations, explained there were eight prioritized Strategic Initiatives Staff would clarify.

Councilor Kuretski stated he was looking for a change in the process to add Council input for Economic Development.

Council and Staff discussed the outcomes of the existing Indiantown Road Overlaying Zoning (IOZ) regulations and determine refinements for new desired outcomes.

Council commented about signage and traffic concerns on Indiantown Road.

Council and Staff discussed providing input on policy issues concerning the Indiantown Road Corridor using a systematic approach to selection of committee members, meeting consistency, data collection, and use of a fact based information collection method.

Council and Staff discussed reduction of crime: how to strategically address additional policing workload generated by an increase in transitory population resulting from the expansion of entertainment-oriented amenities within the Town.

Chief Frank Kitzerow stated he had all the information Council had requested on a PowerPoint.

Council discussed developing and implementing a Social Media Policy.

Vice-Mayor Kaufer suggested increasing the Town's presence on Social Media and educating the public that posting to Social Media creates a public record.

Council and Staff discussed the development of Town policy regarding funding for beach re-nourishment projects in response to Palm Beach County's request for Jupiter's participation and creating an Open Space Fund and investing in new Open Space.

Mayor Wodraska stated he would not be at the July 19, 2016 Town Council Meeting.

Vice-Mayor Kaufer asked Councilor Kuretski about issues raised by the public regarding Councilor Kuretski's comments or postings on Facebook related to possible unethical or illegal activities by Staff related to development approvals in the Inlet Village. Vice-Mayor Kaufer suggested if Councilor Kuretski felt that this was true, Council should address the concerns.

Councilor Kuretski referenced CRA discussions and said he was not calling it illegal; if it may just be the process of the CRA.
