## Resurfacing of Jupiter Lakes Boulevard to Begin August of 2013

Late this summer, a 30-day roadway project on Jupiter Lakes Boulevard from Military Trail to South Old Dixie Highway will get underway. The project will involve roadway milling, asphalt overlay, swale re-grading and striping of the road.

The Town inspects roadway pavements on a regular basis to determine pavement distress and deficiencies, and calculates a "Pavement Condition Index," or PCI. Based on the current pavement condition and age, Jupiter Lakes Boulevard showed a need for resurfacing and rehabilitation. As part of the Town's 5-year Community Investment Program (CIP), the funding was identified and approved for this fiscal year. To ensure the long-term health of the road, an additional one-inch of asphalt will be added to the roadway during the project.

This type of project is a "once-every-25-year" event, and once construction begins, residents, business and visitors should be patient and use caution. Temporary lane closures can be expected during the life of the project, but one lane in each direction will be open for the duration of the project. ## Welcome Jupiter's New Assistant Town Manager, Lori Bonino



On April 1st, Lori Bonino was welcomed to the Town's organization as the new Assistant Town Manager. Lori joins the Town with over 20 years of experience as an administrator in the Palm Beach County School District, with over 15 of those as an administrator.

Lori has an established knowledge of the Jupiter Community, where she has most recently been the principal of Independence Middle School, and before that, of Lighthouse Elementary School. As Assistant Town Manager, Lori will bring her knowledge of administration, employee engagement and community building to manage several aspects of the Town's organization and its operations.

## Jupiter's Water Rates Remain Among the Lowest in the Region

Jupiter Utilities uses the most advanced water treatment technologies available to process up to 30 million gallons of water per day. These technologies, along with good fiscal management, allow it to maintain the third lowest rates in the region spanning from St. Lucie County to Palm Beach County.

A rate of \$1.14 per 1000 gallons of water for Jupiter residents and businesses means a cost of \$0.00114 per gallon. At these rates, a typical 16-ounce bottle of water would cost about \$0.0001425, which normally costs about \$1.23 at a local supermarket. A typical Jupiter customer uses about 10,000 gallons per month, which costs about \$31.30 (see table below). In addition to charges for water, a typical bill also contains fees for garbage, recycling, yard waste collection and stormwater fees.

In the last 30 years, Jupiter Utilities has won over 50 awards for outstanding service and quality, the most recent awards being the 2008 and 2010 EPA Award covering a 9 state region in the Southeastern United States. The utility has also received the FDEP and FSAWWA Awards for three years in a row (2008, 2009 and 2010), and awards for the Best Operated Membrane Plant in both 2011 and 2012 from the Southeastern Desalting Association. Jupiter customers should be proud of their utility's award winning reliability and exceptional quality water.



## Budget Planning for Fiscal Year 2014 Underway

It may only be May, but Town Council and staff have started the process of planning and proposing the municipal budget for fiscal year 2014, which begins October 1, 2013. Town residents pay about 13% of their total property tax bill to the Town. The rest goes to Palm Beach County, the School District, and other taxing agencies and special districts.

The process began in March with a workshop to review the Town's strategic plan, and identify important community initiatives that should be considered in the upcoming budget. Based on property value projections from the Property Appraiser's office and other economic factors, the Town's revenues are estimated and forecasted. Then through a series of budget workshops in the spring and summer, Town Council and staff review budget proposals and potential capital investments. The process ends with two public budget hearings in September where the Council officially adopts the Approved Fiscal Year 2014 Operating Budget and 2014-2019 Community Investment Program (CIP).

## Hurricane Season Begins June 1st: Preparation is the Best Policy

The 2013 hurricane season begins June 1st, and is predicted to be an active season. Preparing for hurricanes is a part of life in South Florida, and it is important to have a plan for your family, your business, and your assets.

For the Town, emergency preparedness is a year-round commitment that involves planning, drilling and preparing for the worst – while hoping for the best. Just as we urge residents to prepare by purchasing supplies, developing a family plan, and readying properties, the Town plans for major storm events on a larger scale.

Should a major event threaten our area, Jupiter would activate its Incident Command Structure (ICS). ICS is a plan, process and organizational structure advocated by the Department of Homeland Security. It allows the Town to identify resources and responsibilities before a storm impacts our area, so that when we are faced with a threat, all duties, supplies and activities are already established and coordinated. Under Jupiter's ICS, Chief of Police Frank Kitzerow acts as Incident Commander. This means that in a potential disaster situation, he leads and manages Town staff, resources and operations with input and direction from the Town Manager and Town Council.

If you and your family or your business has not yet developed an emergency plan, take advantage of the resources available through the Town of Jupiter and Palm Beach County. Don't wait until a hurricane is bearing down to make these important decisions. It is up to everyone to be prepared. ## History Corner

### Jupiter Dedicates Florida Historical Marker for Jupiter Inlet Shipwrecks at Jupiter Beach Park

On Tuesday, April 2, 2013 the Town of Jupiter Historic Resources Board dedicated an historical marker at Jupiter Beach Park for the Jupiter Inlet Shipwrecks from 1600-1700's.

The marker, located near the historic Dubois House, reads:



#### JUPITER INLET SHIPWRECKS 1600-1700s

During the 17th century, Spanish galleons and merchant ships navigated the treacherous waters off the Florida coast. These vessels carried silver and gemstones from the mines of Mexico and Peru. They routinely ran a narrow gauntlet of shallow water, sand bars, coral reefs, and occasional hurricanes off the Jupiter Inlet as they followed the Gulf Stream's swift north current.

The ships that did not survive the passage left a legacy of cannons, anchors, navigational tools, coins, flatware, silver and gold scattered across the ocean floor. Today, this area is nicknamed "The Treasure Coast." Ships thought to have wrecked off the Jupiter coast during the 1600s include the San Miguel Archangel and the San Francisco y San Antonio. Both ships were avisos, Spanish courier ships weighing 60 tons or less. The avisos were well-armed, but speed was their best defense, which allowed them to outrun larger, better-armed vessels. Avisos were primarily used to transport correspondence to and from the Spanish throne, but were known to carry goods and valuables. Shipwrecks like these are important time capsules of history, which increase our understanding of the people who sailed Florida's waters before us.





Eighteen Jupiter communities attended a workshop in February to discuss the criteria for the 2013 Neighborhoods Matching Grant program. Applications were submitted for landscaping, signage, and lighting projects in the various communities. In May, a list of the communities who were awarded grants, along with their projects, will be posted on the Neighborhood Services web page at [www.jupiter.fl.us/neighborhoods](http://www.jupiter.fl.us/neighborhoods). Communities that missed the deadline to apply for this year's program can begin preparing to submit for the 2014 Neighborhood Grant Program, which will be available in February, 2014.

## Community Building Grant

Looking for a way to build community spirit in your neighborhood? Community Building Grants are available throughout the year for up to \$250. The application is available on the Neighborhood Services web page at [www.jupiter.fl.us/neighborhoods](http://www.jupiter.fl.us/neighborhoods). Groups may use funds for projects that introduce community members to one another and improve the social network of a defined neighborhood. In addition, to build awareness and activity around recycling and litter prevention this year, Community Building grant recipients are required to incorporate these activities into their events. Examples may include litter pick-up activities, handing out recycling bins by partnering with the Solid Waste Authority, and other litter and recycling education. ## Tighter Restrictions on Illegal Commercial Kitchens Operating in Jupiter's Neighborhoods



On March 5, 2013 at its regular meeting, the Town Council approved an ordinance to spell out the responsibilities and penalties for both property owners and occupants of houses operating illegal commercial kitchens in Jupiter's neighborhoods.

The need for the ordinance rose out of several years of increasing numbers of complaints from residents due to the increased noise and activity in the early morning hours and the accumulation of trash. In addition to the complaints, the kitchens posed health and safety risks from unsafe practices as well as potential fire and explosion risks.

Before this ordinance, the Town could only hold property owners responsible. Often tenants would be evicted by the owner for operating the kitchens, and would simply move to another location in the same neighborhood or nearby neighborhoods in the Town. The new ordinance allows the Town's code compliance officers and police officers to cite both owners and occupants when an illegal commercial kitchen exists.




