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Town Council Corner: Policy Actions and Decisions during early 2014

Below is a summary of some of the approvals and decisions made by Town Council at their meetings during the first part of 2014. - Approved contracts with Harris Computer Corporation, Tele-Works, Inc. and Lucity, Inc. totaling \$1,348,016 to install new software systems including utility billing, cash receipting and enterprise asset management. These systems will benefit the Town with greater efficiency and allow more self-serve access for residents and customers.
- Approved an expansion of the Bluffs Marina at 1320 Tidal Pointe Boulevard by adding yacht slips, day slips, accessory boatlifts, parking spaces, and pilings, and increasing the size of the dockmaster building.
- Approved a spring training parking management plan proposed by Abacoa Town Center and Roger Dean Stadium that includes a parking charge of \$10 in the garage adjacent to the Courtyard Marriott (during spring training only).
- Approved the demolition of an existing building and the construction of a new building and parking garage for a motor vehicle sales facility for Braman Motorcars, located at 1555 West Indiantown Road.
- Approved Phase II of the Jupiter Medical Park project, which includes a 26,500 square foot medical office building on the southeast corner of Military Trail and Jupiter Lakes Boulevard. This project will relocate the existing Margaret W. Niedland Breast Center from its existing location and provide additional space for other medical professionals.
- Approved a plan for South Jupiter Community Park, located at 1501 Frederick Small Road, to change the five previously-approved baseball fields to four multi-purpose fields. The fields will be used by youth recreational leagues, and available to the public. Parking and restrooms are also included in the plan.
- Approved necessary agreements with Florida Power and Light for underground conversion and applicant installed facilities in the Inlet Village on A1A from Jupiter Beach Road to US Highway 1. These agreements allow Phase 1 of a project to reconstruct A1A between US1 and Jupiter Beach Road beginning in July, 2014.



Jupiter Waterway Trail Mobile Guide Available in the App Store Soon!




Paddling enthusiasts in Jupiter will soon have a hi-tech way to navigate their waterway routes. The Jupiter Waterway Trail Mobile Guide is a downloadable app available for the iPhone that allows a user to find and map trails along Jupiter's 39 miles of waterways, share favorite routes, find points of interest and learn about businesses offering ecotourism services.

The app is free to download, and also offers ecotourism-focused businesses an opportunity to advertise within the app. Look for it in the App Store this summer and enjoy Jupiter's beautiful Waterway Trail!

A1A Roadway Improvement Project Inlet Village Open for Business During Construction

In approximately July of this year, the first phase of a project to redesign A1A in the Inlet Village from US1 to Jupiter Beach Road will begin. In the first phase, utilities will be buried underground, and drainage systems installed. Phase two, which will begin about one year later, will include redesigning the roadway to enhance pedestrian access, lighting, bicycle lanes and landscaping.

During each phase of the construction, lane closures and lane shifting will occur, but the roadway will be open to through traffic, and the businesses within the Inlet Village will remain open and accessible. Motorists, pedestrians and cyclists are urged to use caution during construction.

Did You Know? Jupiter's Award-winning Water is a Good Deal!



Jupiter's water treatment plant uses the most advanced water treatment technologies to process up to 30 million gallons of water per day. In addition to making a lot of water, the plant and its end product are also award-winning, receiving over 50 awards for outstanding service and quality in the last 30 years. Most recently, the Town of Jupiter Water Treatment Plant received the 2013 Plant Operations Excellence Award for the Southeast DEP district from the Florida Department of Environmental Protection for excellence in operations and maintenance.

In addition to high-quality and state-of-the-art plant operations, Jupiter's rates are the third lowest in the region from St. Lucie County to Palm Beach County. The table to the right illustrates water costs for a typical residential user across several different water utilities. In Jupiter, a typical customer uses about 10,000 gallons per month and pays about \$31.32 for their water. At \$1.14 per 1000 gallons of water – or \$0.00114 per gallon – this is much less than the cost of bottled water at the supermarket.

June 1st is the Start of Hurricane Season and Florida's Rainy Season

Are you Prepared for a Storm or Flood Event?

June 1 marks the beginning of the Atlantic hurricane season. Whether you believe it will be an active season or not, it is always best to prepare your family, your home and your business in the event that a hurricane, tropical storm or flood conditions occur in the area.

Emergency preparedness is a year-round commitment for the Town that involves planning, drilling and preparing for the worst – while hoping for the best. Residents and businesses are urged to prepare by purchasing supplies, developing a family plan, and readying properties.

If a major event threatens the area, Jupiter activates its Incident Command Structure (ICS). ICS is a plan, process and organizational structure advocated by the Department of Homeland Security that allows the Town to manage and deploy resources to respond effectively. Responsibilities and activities are coordinated before a storm impacts our

area, so that if we are faced with a threat, all duties and supplies are established and in place. Under Jupiter's ICS, Chief of Police Frank Kitzerow acts as Incident Commander. This means that in a potential disaster situation, he leads and manages Town staff, resources and operations with input and direction from the Town Manager and Town Council.

If you and your family or your business have not yet developed an emergency plan, take advantage of the resources available through the Town of Jupiter and Palm Beach County. Don't wait until a hurricane or storm event is threatening to make these important decisions. It is up to everyone to be prepared. 
Public Restrooms Open in Inlet Village Park next to Guanabana's



In March, 2014, public restrooms were opened for use in a new building on the south side of Guanabana's restaurant, adjacent to Inlet Village Park. The restrooms were constructed by Guanabana's as part of their expansion on land they purchased from the Town. In addition to funding the construction of the public restrooms, Guanabana's will maintain and operate the restrooms for use by their patrons and the general public. The building that houses the restrooms, which was constructed in a style reflective of the Inlet Village's character and architecture, also houses a kitchen and restaurant offices.

There are three grant categories for individuals who qualify:

Housing Rehabilitation: Up to \$20,000 to repair roof, windows, exterior doors and garage doors.

Emergency Repairs: Up to \$10,000 to repair roof, windows, exterior doors and garage doors.



Lower Fees for Some Motorists Coming September 1, 2014

Effective September 1, 2014, motorists could pay \$20 to \$25 less for vehicle and mobile home registrations, depending on vehicle size. The reduction, approved by the State Legislature, is due to a rollback of increases in vehicle registration fees from 2009. However, some motorists will not benefit from this fee rollback legislation. Excluded from the rollback are those motorists who purchased a two-year registration renewal before September 1, 2014.
