Town Council and Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA) Commission Corner: Recent Policy Actions

Below is a summary of some of the approvals and decisions made by the Town Council and the CRA Commission during recent meetings. To see items coming up on agendas for future meetings, visit www.jupiter.fl.us/agendas.

Town Council

- Approved a change in the application for the Institute for Healthy Living, an assisted living, rehabilitative and acute care facility to be located between Central Boulevard and University Drive, just west of Corporate Way in Abacoa. This change includes a modification in partnership for the facility from Florida Atlantic University to the Scripps Research Institute.
- Approved an amendment to the building code to add flood prevention and protection standards in line with the State of Florida's building code.
- Established regulations to allow microbreweries in various commercial and mixed use zones within the Town.
- Approved funding donations to local organizations that provide services to Jupiter residents not provided by the Town. Donation recipients included Jupiter High School, Jupiter Middle School, William T. Dwyer High School, Furry Friends Adoption Clinic, Busch Wildlife Sanctuary, and the Loxahatchee River Center.
- Supported a future Florida Department of Transportation project on the section of US1 between Jupiter and Tequesta to reconfigure through lanes and add turn lanes and bicycle lanes, as well as to analyze intersection improvement opportunities for Alternate A1A, Old Dixie Highway and Riverside Drive.
- Approved the purchase of 15 police vehicles funded by the Town's Community Investment program and operating budget.
- Approved a contract to reconstruct the roadway on A1A between US1 and Jupiter Beach Road to include bicycle lanes, sidewalks, landscaping, lighting and other amenities.
- Approved an adjustment to the rate for irrigation-quality water of 0.8%.
- Approved the Jupiter Medical and Technology Park, a 50,000 square foot building at 1701 Military Trail.
- Approved the replacement of skate ramps at the Skate Park at Abacoa Community Park.

Community Redevelopment Agency

- Approved proceeding to contract negotiations between the CRA and The Free Ride, Inc. for point-to-point electric taxi service in the Inlet Village area.

Jupiter Water In a League of its Own

The Jupiter Utility service area encompasses over 45 square miles including Jupiter, Juno Beach, and many unincorporated areas of Palm Beach and Martin counties, serving more than 80,000 customers with award-winning water. Jupiter Utilities was awarded the Safe Drinking Water Act Excellence Award by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) in 1999, 2001, 2008 and 2010. Jupiter Utilities was also the recipient of the Plant Operations Excellence Award in 2008, 2009, 2010 and 2013, from the Florida Department of Environmental Protection. These accolades are proof that Jupiter Utilities strives to provide a quality product to its customers.

In addition, Jupiter Utilities has managed to provide award-winning water and service at one of the most affordable rates in Palm Beach County. The table to the right illustrates the cost of service for a typical residence using 10,000 gallons per month. The Jupiter Utilities customer pays approximately \$32.45, that's 22.9% less than the average rate of the other listed utilities.

May 30, 2015 Dive for a Cause 5th Annual Lionfish Roundup



Junior Police Academy hosted by the Jupiter Police Department




