



Town Council Corner: Policy Actions

Below is a summary of some of the approvals and decisions made by the Town Council during recent meetings. To see items coming up on agendas for future meetings, visit www.jupiter.fl.us/agendas.

- Approved a site plan amendment at 1132 W. Indiantown Road (Annie's Gourmet Market) to provide shared and off-site parking with Burrito Brothers and change the use from retail and office to medical office.
- Approved a one-time contribution of \$26,010 to assist with funding for a project for the Andrew "Red" Harris Artificial Reef Foundation.
- Approved the preliminary ad valorem property tax (TRIM) rate for Fiscal Year 2016, which begins October 1, 2015. The proposed rate is 2.5142, which is equal to the rate for the current fiscal year (FY2015). This TRIM (Truth in Millage) rate is preliminary; the final property tax (millage) rate will be heard in two public budget hearings on Thursday, September 3, 2015 and Thursday, September 17, 2015.
- Conducted an installation and swearing-in ceremony for Councilor Ben Klug. Councilor Klug has accepted the appointment for the seat formerly occupied by Wendy Harrison.
- Approved the Town's application to the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to access Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding. This application provides approximately \$264,337 in CDBG funding for fiscal year 2016.
- Approved an amendment to the Coastal Management section of the Town's Comprehensive Plan to change regulations for bulkheads and seawalls; to add policies and strategies to protect property and infrastructure from impacts from climate change; and to modify elements related to green design regulations.
- Approved a zoning text amendment to the Marine Facilities section of the Town's code to allow new and replacement shoreline stabilization structures, waivers for marine facility setbacks, and change language regarding the mooring of boats on natural waterways and canals.
- Approved a two-year contract with the Police Benevolent Association (PBA), the collective-bargaining organization for the Town's police officers.
- Submitted a letter to the Florida Development Finance Corporation regarding Town Council's concerns with issuing private activity bonds to All Aboard Florida.
- Approved six Neighborhood Enhancement Matching Grants totaling \$23,525 to Cypress Cove HOA, Egret Landing HOA, Indian Creek Keystone Condo Association, Indian Creek Pinecrest Condo Association, Jupiter Village Phase II, and Oceanside Terrace Condo Association.
- Approved a special exception for a microbrewery called the Civil Society Brewing Company at 1200 Town Center Drive, Unit 101.
- Approved a contract with Sunshine Land Design, Inc. for a park renovation project in Pine Gardens South Park.
- Approved a Comprehensive Plan amendment to modify workforce housing policies and to update the affordable and workforce housing needs assessment.
- Approved a zoning text amendment requested by the Abacoa Property Owners Assembly to modify the regulations for entry features and community directional signs (this approval was amended to eliminate the request for electronic LED signs).
- Approved committing \$35,000 from the Town's Economic Development Fund for the local share of the State's Qualified Target Industry Tax Refund incentive program to encourage the retention and expansion of "Project Chew" within the Town of Jupiter. This commitment provides the 20% local match of the \$175,000 Qualified Target Industry Tax Refund. The State of Florida's portion of this incentive will be \$140,000.
- Approved an amendment to the building code to add flood prevention and protection standards, and an amendment to the Town's code to make it consistent with the Florida building code regarding flood prevention and protection standards.

Jupiter Holds Public Budget Hearings for Fiscal Year 2016

The Town of Jupiter's proposed budget for Fiscal Year 2016, which begins October 1, 2015, will be heard in two public budget hearings in September: Thursday, September 3, 2015 and Thursday, September 17, 2015. Both hearings will be held at 7:00 pm in Town Council Chambers at Town Hall.

In July, the Town Council approved a preliminary "Truth in Millage" (TRIM) rate of 2.5142 mills (dollars per \$1,000 of taxable value), excluding voter-approved debt. At this tax rate, total ad valorem tax revenue for FY 2016 would be approximately \$20.7 million. This is \$1.7 million higher than FY 2015 due to an increase in projected property values.


In advance of the official public hearings in September, several public budget workshops were held throughout

the summer. Proposals included investments in infrastructure and personnel in order to respond to community growth while continuing to deliver high quality services to residents and businesses. By analyzing the needs of the community, the elements of the Town's strategic plan, and prioritizing investments, the Town Council worked toward a proposal that balances growth and fiscal responsibility.

The Town's project to improve A1A between US1 and Jupiter Beach Road is progressing, and if you've visited the Inlet Village in the past several months, you'll notice some big changes taking place. The first phase, which involves installing underground infrastructure, is nearly complete. The second phase, which is just underway, will create a more pedestrian and bicycle-friendly streetscape. Included in this phase will be new sidewalks, bike lanes, lighting, cross-walks street-scaping and landscaping. The entire project is expected to be complete in the Spring of 2016, and everyone is encouraged to continue enjoying the businesses and views of the Inlet during construction.

1915 FEC Train Depot Restored

In 1915, a new Florida East Coast (FEC) passenger and freight depot was opened in Jupiter where Johnston Park is today, along Alternate A1A just north of Indiantown Road. The Jupiter depot was one of many constructed during the period by FEC, and it served the Jupiter community for many years until it was closed in the mid-1960's. Eventually, it was moved to Tequesta to become a private residence, where it rested until 2012.

Eventually, the Depot will become a space where community organizations can gather for small meetings and gatherings. For information on how you can contribute to the efforts to restore and maintain the historic Train Depot, visit the Loxahatchee Guild's website at www.loxahatcheeguild.org.

On April 15, 2012, thanks to the efforts of the Town of Jupiter, the members of the Loxahatchee Guild, and the Village of Tequesta, the depot was moved to Sawfish Bay Park, across Alternate A1A and slightly north of its original location. Soon after, work began to fund-raise and begin construction to restore the Depot to nearly its original state. On July 31, 2015, members of the Loxahatchee Guild, the Town, and community members gathered to celebrate the progress and cut the ribbon on the historic Train Depot.




Opening Day at the All-New Abacoa Community Park Saturday, September 5, 2015

Congratulations to the 2015 Neighborhood Grant Recipients

On May 5, 2015, the Town Council approved \$23,525 in matching grants to 6 different neighborhood groups in the Town.

HOMESTEAD EXEMPTION OUTREACH



On **September 2, October 7, November 4 & December 2, 2015** from 2-3pm, the Palm Beach County Property Appraiser's Office, Division of Education Services, will be at Town Hall in Jupiter to take your 2015 Homestead Exemption application and answer valuation questions.

Every person who has legal title on January 1 to a residential property and lives there permanently qualifies for this exemption. You must be a permanent resident of Florida on January 1 of the initial application year. You may either apply by mail or in person at any time through the year but the deadline is March 1 of the qualifying year.

A copy of your deed and proof of residency is required. You may submit a copy of your Florida driver's license, voter's registration or permanent residency card. In lieu of a pending permanent resident alien card, we will accept Federal Form I485, "Approval Notice for application to adjust to permanent resident status."

Exemptions available include: \$25,000 Homestead Exemption, Additional \$25,000 Homestead Exemption, Senior Citizen Exemption, \$5,000 Disabled Veterans Exemption, Combat-disabled Senior Veterans and the \$500 Widow/Widower Exemption.

Community Action Program Now Accepting Applications for Assistance with Home Energy Costs

The Community Action Program (CAP) is now accepting applications for Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP). Applicants must be a resident of Florida and must meet the poverty income guidelines set for the program in the state of Florida. To apply for benefits, please call **561-694-5474**. The Community Action Program office is located at 6515 Indiantown Road, Jupiter 33458.

Home energy documentation required:

1. Florida Power & Light (FPL) utility bill.
2. Proof of current income for all household members. Examples include social security, pension, VA retirement award letters, pay stubs if employed. Unfortunately a 1099 cannot be accepted.
3. Photo I.D. for all household members 18 years and older, and birth certificates for members under 18 years of age. For example, a driver's license, Florida I.D., Palm Tran Connection I.D., etc.
4. Social Security cards for all household members.
5. If you are a resident of Section 8 or public housing, please provide Utility Allowance Reimbursement.
6. If you are receiving food stamps, proof of eligibility is required.



Access to Healthcare: MyClinic

MyClinic (formerly known as Jupiter Community Health Services, Inc.), began operating as an independent, not-for-profit free clinic in November, 2013. MyClinic is temporarily located in a modular building next to the existing Health Department, Jupiter Auxiliary Clinic at 6405 West Indiantown Road in Jupiter.

Health care at MyClinic is provided exclusively by volunteer professionals. Jupiter Medical Center provides Lab and Imaging services including mammograms to clinic patients free of charge as well as administrative support. Medical office equipment has been donated by Clinics Can Help.

MyClinic is open Tuesday through Saturday and offers primary care for adults, including dental care. Patients are seen by appointment. For more information, visit www.myclinicjupiter.org or call **561-203-7511**.

Recently, Town staff received a proposal for review for a mixed development project along Love Street in the Inlet Village. The 3.8-acre property fronts the Jupiter Inlet on the north and A1A on the south, and is located along Love Street, where the current public parking lot is located.

The proposal is for a small-scale planned unit development with waterfront restaurants, a café, retail shops, vacation rental units, and office space. The proposal also includes a parking garage, which would be lined by the retail shops on the first floor and vacation rental units on the second floor.

The application is tentatively scheduled to be reviewed before the Planning and Zoning Commission and Town Council this fall.
