



Town Council Corner: Policy Actions

Below is a summary of some of the approvals and decisions made by the Town Council and the Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA) Commission during recent meetings. To see items coming up on agendas for future meetings, visit www.jupiter.fl.us/agendas.

Town Council

- Approved private stormwater improvement grants totaling \$24,296 for Indian Creek Phase One HOA and Laurel Oaks at Jupiter HOA to assist with private stormwater system improvement projects in the neighborhoods. Also approved stormwater management system redevelopment grants totaling \$41,542 for B&B Equities LLC (Boyd Medical Office Building) and Dogs World LLC to assist with stormwater system redevelopment projects.
- Approved two agreements related to the project to reconstruct A1A from Jupiter Beach Road to US One: a supplemental agreement for \$414,083 between the Town of Jupiter and the Florida Department of Transportation; and a joint participation agreement between the Loxahatchee Environmental Control District and the Town of Jupiter.
- Approved a special exception and site plan amendment for an expansion of the existing Jupiter West Community Health Center on approximately 1 acre of an 8.6-acre site at 6405 West Indiantown Road.
- Approved using Federal asset forfeiture funds for the following programs: approved \$3,000 for the "Shop with a Cop" event and for a donation to the Head Start

program; approved \$64,500 to update the Mobile Command Vehicle; approved \$7,000 for training on Fair and Impartial Policing for Command Staff and Community Leaders.

- Approved funding up to \$35,000 from the Town's Economic Development Fund for the local share of the Qualified Targeted Industries Tax Refund matching grant for "Project Link".
- Approved a purchase of 21 police vehicles in the amount of \$698,034.
- Approved special exception and site plan applications for an expansion to the existing Maltz Jupiter Theater, located on a 4.8 acre property at 1001 E. Indiantown Road.
- Approved renaming Pine Gardens South Park to Officer Bruce St. Laurent Park.

Community Redevelopment Agency Commission

- Discussed the Inlet Village parking management plan.
- Approved an interlocal agreement with the Treasure Coast Regional Planning Council for the development of a conceptual design for Indiantown Road from US Highway One to A1A.

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

PRESERVING JUPITER'S NATURAL AREAS



We Love Our Open Spaces

The Town of Jupiter Town Council has identified the preservation of green space as one of the Town's nine strategic initiatives. In short, we love our open, green spaces.

For decades, the Town has secured and maintained these green spaces to ensure preservation of native habitat and provide the public access to enjoy these natural areas.

The Town has achieved this green space success through a number of ways:

- Establishing mutually beneficial partnerships with agencies and foundations to transfer land and share management responsibilities.
- Securing grant funding to maintain native habitat and remove invasive species.
- Passing a \$17 million dollar land conservation referendum (2004) to preserve green space rather than developing it.

Open spaces are one of the important components that make us "uniquely" Jupiter.

Updates on Open Space Improvements

Improvement projects are currently underway at six of the ten Jupiter Open Space locations to remove non-native or exotic vegetation, plant native species and, when possible, provide the public greater open space access.

- 1. Fullerton Island** – The only island in the Open Space program is located just west of Burt Reynolds Park and is accessible only by boat. The island features several boat slips, a lagoon and paddleboard or kayak opportunities through and around the island. In partnership with Palm Beach County, island restoration included eradication of exotics and planting of native species.
- 3. Jones Creek Preserve** – A 1.36-acre site located along Jones Creek on the south side of Indiantown Road. Exotic vegetation has been removed and native vegetation has been planted. Other native plants such as Slash Pines, Green Buttonwood and Mangroves were also planted to restore native habitat. Future plans include a kayak launch since the creek leads to the Loxahatchee River.
- 5. Sims Creek Preserve** – This 2.8-acre site is located along the east side of Center Street. Exotic vegetation

has been removed from this unique property featuring large oaks, pine flatwoods and Mangroves along the creek. A kayak launch is being considered as Sims Creek leads to the Loxahatchee River.

- 6. Cinquez Park Open Space** – The 13-acre site is located in the heart of Jupiter on Indiantown Road. Plans for this open space include on-street parking, a dog park, gazebos, a playground and a tree house. Other features include a natural area along the north of the site, a lake and open grass field areas.
- 7. Washington Street Preserve** – This year the town sought and was awarded a Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission grant for exotic vegetation removal. Improvements for this 16-acre open space are in the preliminary stages while awaiting the grant funding process.
- 9. Jones Creek Headwaters** – This 22-acre preserve

is located on Military Trail between Maplecrest to the south, Barcelona to the north and Paseos to the west. This preserve was given to the town by the McArthur Foundation in the 1980's, and contains pine flatwoods and a hardwood wetland swamp. Continued exotic removal and maintenance to keep the site free of exotics as well as minor tree trimming and debris cleanup is in the works. A preliminary site plan has been prepared which identifies long term improvements including a nature path and boardwalk system.

- 10. Todd Street Mangrove Preserve** – In 2014, the Town purchased an additional Open Space property along the west end of Todd Street through a tax deed sale paid for by the Open Space bond money. The 1.17-acre property contains mangrove habitat and sits along Jones Creek. The town is pursuing grant opportunities for exotic plant removal.

Jupiter Police Department Special Needs Registry

To enhance services provided to the greater Jupiter community, and specifically to the local special needs population, the Jupiter Police Department announces its new Special Needs Registry program. While other communities have made similar efforts, the Jupiter Police Department is one of the first in the state to take a more comprehensive approach to special needs support.

Voluntarily, and confidentially, residents and frequent visitors to the Town can register their loved one with the Jupiter Police Department. This involves providing details about the registered individual, such as methods of communication, sensory issues, and/or common behaviors. In addition, the parent or guardian provides contact information to ensure JPD can easily contact them if necessary. The registered individual will receive an identification card and bracelet with a unique number. If JPD support is required for this individual at any time, the bracelet or ID card will alert the officer to reference the special needs registry. Through this registry, officers will have real-time information and be able to respond in the most efficient and effective manner for the individual. In short, JPD officers will be able to provide tailored and timely customer service to the members of our community who need it most.

This unique program was made possible through partnerships with families, local agencies and large organizations specializing in the care and research of special needs and at-risk populations. The Els Center of Excellence, Florida Atlantic University's Center for Autism and Related Disabilities (CARD), Autism Speaks and the Center for Missing and Exploited Children have been instrumental JPD partners through the program's development.

Development in Jupiter - A General Overview

Have you ever wondered how new development proposals are handled by the Town? As you can imagine, it's quite the process and it starts at the Planning and Zoning Department.

Submit Application / Meet with Planning and Zoning Department

Anyone wishing to develop in Jupiter must schedule a preapplication appointment with Planning and Zoning to submit their development application. Once submitted and based upon the submission date, the application will be scheduled for a Planning and Zoning Commission hearing and Town Council. It's important to note that only "sufficient" applications will be reviewed by the Planning and Zoning Commission and Town Council. If Planning and Zoning finds the application to be "insufficient", meaning changes are required for any reason, the applicant must make corrections and resubmit.

Application Sufficient / Now a Planning and Zoning Commission Review

The Planning and Zoning Commission is made up of seven Jupiter residents who make formal recommendations to the Town Council regarding site plans, planned unit developments (PUD), amendments to the Town Zoning Code, as well as land use changes and much more. If the Commission makes a recommendation of approval, the application advances through the process.

Application Recommended by P&Z Commission / Town Council Public Hearing

Following Planning and Zoning Commission recommendation, the application is scheduled for a public hearing by Town Council and placed on the Town Council meeting agenda. Town Council will review the application, staff, and commission recommendations, however the Council comments, approves or disapproves at their own discretion. In addition, if more information or discussion is needed, Town Council may choose to continue the item, which means a development application could be "continued" to a future meeting.

Town Council Second Public Hearing

If a second public hearing is required and Town Council approves the first reading of an application, a second reading is scheduled (note: site plans, small-scale PUD's, and special exceptions only require one reading.) This provides the Town Council another opportunity to review the application, as well as provide the public an additional opportunity to comment. Following an approval of a second reading, the application is considered approved by the Town of Jupiter.

Transparency is essential to the development application process. From open communication between the customer and Town staff, to open forums for public comment like Commission and Town Council meetings, the entire development process at the Town is an open book. Love Street Project Proposal

The Love Street Project Proposal is a small-scale planned unit development that would sit on 3.8 acres between A1A and the Jupiter Inlet, and potentially include uses like retail shops, dining, a parking structure, office space, vacation rentals and open public space. This project is still in the application and review process, and a good example of how applications are processed. The Love Street application was reviewed and recommended for approval by the Planning and Zoning Commission on November 10, 2015. The application was then scheduled for a public reading by Town Council on December 15, 2015. If the application is continued, this proposal will be moved to a subsequent Town Council meeting. Members of the public are encouraged to attend Town Council meetings on the first and third Tuesday of the month at 7pm.



2016 Matching Grant Program

Your neighborhood may be eligible to receive a grant!



Applications for the 2016 Town of Jupiter Neighborhood Matching Grant will be available online the first week of February, 2016. Completed applications will be due March 18, 2016. A workshop to discuss the grant criteria will be held on February 11, 2016 at 6:00 p.m. at the Jupiter Community Center, 200 Military Trail. Communities who send at least one representative to the workshop will receive an additional 10 points towards their application. HOA property managers representing a community will NOT receive the bonus points. Communities that were awarded Matching or Distress Grants within the previous three years (2013-2015) are not eligible to apply in 2016.

Grants may be awarded for neighborhood improvements between \$1,000 and \$5,000 (1 for 1 community match required). A combination of cash and in-kind support will be accepted. The maximum in-kind contribution can be up to 50% of the community’s portion of the funding.




