



Town Council Corner: Recent Policy Actions

Below is a summary of some of the approvals and decisions made by the Town Council during recent meetings. To see items coming up on agendas for future meetings, visit www.jupiter.fl.us/Agendas. To watch meetings live, or to watch recorded meetings on-demand, visit www.jupiter.fl.us/LIVE.

- Appropriated \$71,400 from the Town's Economic Development Fund for the local share of the State's Qualified Targeted Industry (QTI) Tax Refund incentive program for the relocation of "Project Pick" to Jupiter. This commitment provides the 20% local match of the \$357,000 QTI Tax Refund and will be spread out over the next 5-6 years. The State's portion of the incentive is \$285,600.
- Decided not to send a letter of support for the Jupiter Inlet District's (JID) TIGER Grant application to modify the structure of the Loxahatchee River Bridge. The denial of support was based on the fact that supporting the project implies support for All Aboard Florida.
- Funded seventeen (17) neighborhood matching grants at a total of \$61,544. The funding supports \$919,615 in projects in those 17 neighborhoods.
- Allocated \$5,000 in state asset forfeiture funds for a donation to the Gulf Stream Council's Learning for Life Explorer Program in support of the Law Enforcement Explorer Academy and \$3,000 in state forfeiture funds for a donation to the Jupiter High School Criminal Justice Academy.
- Approved a 5-year extension of the lease for the Florida Inlet Navigation District (FIND) Park, located at 211 River Park Drive.
- Amended the mixed-use sign code in the section titled "Community Commercial (CC) and Town Center (TC) sub-districts" to reduce the distance separation requirement for monument signs on properties over five acres. This supported an application for signage at Abacoa Plaza on Donald Ross Road (and other community and town center properties).
- Amended the planned unit development (PUD) for Admirals' Cove, located on the northeast corner of Alternate A1A and Frederick Small Road. The PUD amendment increased the maximum length of a terminal platform for single family homes on two platted lots and defined dock standards.
- Amended the planned unit development (PUD) for Jupiter Yacht Club to remove the use restrictions and allow all uses permitted within the zoning district, including ground-floor office, at the Mariner Building, located at 400 South US Highway 1.
- Directed staff to use the Town's interlocal agreement with the Palm Beach County School District for use of the Jupiter High School field in order to allow the annual Powder Puff Tackle Football game to occur.
- Made appointments to the Town's Boards and Committees, and County organizations for more information, please visit www.jupiter.fl.us.
- Amended the Jupiter West Commercial planned unit development (PUD) to allow changes to the width of the landscape buffer, the amount of greenspace, and the size and number of wall signs. The PUD contains the McDonald's restaurant and is located on 8.1 acres at the southwest corner of Indiantown Road and Roosevelt Road/68th Terrace.
- Approved the preliminary ad valorem property tax (TRIM) rate for Fiscal Year 2017, which begins October 1, 2016. The proposed rate is 2.4834, which is equal to the rate for the current fiscal year (FY2016). This TRIM (Truth in Millage) rate is preliminary; the final property tax (millage) rate will be heard in two public budget hearings. - Approved the Love Street small-scale planned unit development (PUD), a special exception for a marine facility, and a site plan for retail, restaurant, and office, located on a 3.8-acre property at 1116 Love Street.

Public Budget Meetings: Fiscal Year 2017

The Town of Jupiter's proposed budget for Fiscal Year 2017, which begins October 1, 2016, will be heard in two public budget hearings, on September 8, 2016 and September 20, 2016. Both hearings will be held at 7:00 pm in Town Council Chambers at Town Hall.

In July, the Town Council approved a preliminary "Truth in Millage" (TRIM) rate of 2.4834 mills (dollars per \$1,000 of taxable value), excluding voter-approved debt. At this proposed tax rate, total ad valorem tax revenue for FY 2017 would be approximately \$24,083,209. This is \$1.9 million higher than the tax revenue for FY 2016 due in part to an increase in property values. In the previous year property values, including new construction, saw a Town-wide increase of 9.235%.

Public budget workshops were held throughout the summer in advance of the official public hearings scheduled for September. Proposals included investments in infrastructure and personnel, as well as redistribution of current assets and resources, in order to continue to provide high quality services to residents and businesses. Through thoughtful consideration of community needs and the Town's current strategic plan, the Town Council has developed a comprehensive budget proposal that balances both fiscal responsibility and growth.

A1A Project Completion

If you've visited the Inlet Village recently, you may have noticed the A1A Roadway Enhancement Project is now complete. The second and final phase of the 8-million dollar project included the most visible changes which consisted of the installation of bike lanes, continuous sidewalks, cross walks, speed tables, streetlights, on-street parking, improved pedestrian signage and landscaping. Phase one of the project involved the under-grounding of utilities and the installation of drainage systems, essential for the tropical weather events we experience in south Florida.

The Town of Jupiter and the Loxahatchee Guild recently hosted two open house days at the historic 1915 FEC Train Depot located at Sawfish Bay Park. Once a stop on Henry Flagler's famous railroad, this historic building was moved in 2012 to its current location, not far from where it originally stood. Since its relocation, the depot has undergone significant restoration efforts thanks in part to the generosity of the Loxahatchee Guild and members of the Jupiter community.

For the open house, representatives from the Loxahatchee Guild and the Town dressed in period clothing and served as tour guides. Visitors were issued a train ticket and invited to step back in time to learn more about Jupiter's unique, vibrant history.

Parks and Public Works Keeping Jupiter Beautiful

Our Parks and Public Works Department does an impeccable job caring for our beautiful parks and open spaces. There is an art to maintaining our green grass athletic fields year-round and a commitment to keeping these areas safe for our residents and visitors.

In addition to routine maintenance, it's crucial to allow our fields to "rest." This means periodic closings of fields to all traffic, allowing the turf to regenerate and grow unimpeded. Recently, you may have noticed that fields in two of Jupiter's most popular parks were temporarily closed. Jupiter Community Park recently underwent renovations and maintenance that included field resurfacing and facility repairs, while Abacoa Community Park underwent renovations to rest and restore the popular, well-used fields.



Your help is always appreciated to ensure our parks stay in excellent condition. Please remember the following when visiting a Town park:

- No dogs allowed. We love dogs too, but with so many athletes running around it can be too crowded for pets.
- No golfing allowed. We love golf too, but divots can create problems. These patches are slow to grow back and can leave hazardous holes for little athletes.
- No field parking allowed. We love close parking too, but please park in designated areas and keep vehicles off of the fields. Remember to lock your car and keep valuables out of sight.

The Jupiter Police Department's Neighborhood Enhancement Team (NET) is committed to enhancing community safety and improving quality of life issues in local

neighborhoods. This is accomplished through collaboration with the Neighborhood Services Department and other specialized police units. The following police officers are assigned to specific neighborhoods where they attend neighborhood meetings and interact with residents. When you see your NET Officer, be sure to introduce yourself. They are there for you!

Officer Sherri Bodenheimer – The Heights of Jupiter and Cinquez Park

Officer Bodenheimer has been with the Jupiter Police Department since July 2003. In addition to the NET team, she has been assigned to the Community Activities Unit and Road Patrol.

Officer Roberto Diaz – Pine Gardens South

Officer Diaz has been with the Jupiter Police Department since November 2006. In addition to the NET team, he has been assigned to SWAT and Road Patrol. Officer Diaz is also a veteran of the United States Marine Corps.

Officer Leonard Crawford has been with the Jupiter Police Department since 2009. In addition to the NET team, he has been assigned to Road Patrol. Officer Crawford's law enforcement career began in 1981. In that time, he has served in many capacities including Marine Patrol, Academy Instructor, K-9 Handler, Detective, Sergeant, Lieutenant assigned to Patrol and Criminal Investigations.

Officer O'Neil Anderson – Pine Gardens North

CYBER SECURITY WORKSHOPS

Offered by the Jupiter Police Department and Neighborhood Services in partnership with the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children



This summer, Neighborhood Services hosted three Cyber Security workshops geared towards seniors, parents, and families. Over 150 people attended these informative workshops which were led by the Jupiter Police Department and the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children.

If you missed the workshop series, don't worry, these will be offered again at a future date. In the meantime, keep these helpful Department of Homeland Security tips in mind when using email and the internet.

- Cyber criminals are often anonymous on the internet. Never reveal personal information to strangers online. This includes your name, address, age, phone number, birthday, social security number, your doctor's name and insurance policy numbers.
- Before entering contests, joining clubs, or sharing personal information, make sure you are on a reputable website. Be cautious of "free" gifts and prizes, pop-up advertisements and links. These can all lead to non-reputable sites and possible computer viruses.
- Question when personal information is requested via email. Most reputable companies and organizations, such as banks, charities, schools, and companies, will not ask for personal information via email.
- Use caution when clicking links included in email chains, even if they're from a known friend. Cyber criminals are clever and can use a friend's email address to send harmful malware that could retrieve personal information from your computer or even damage your computer's operating system.


