



Coming Soon to a Riverwalk Near You... One-and-Three-Quarter Miles of Waterfront Pathway!

Riverwalk at Waterpointe Completes the South End of the Jupiter Riverwalk

The final section of the south end of the Jupiter Riverwalk is under construction! Known as Riverwalk at Waterpointe, this 520-foot long section will connect Tierra Del Sol with Mangrove Bay on the south end of the Riverwalk. Once complete, there will be 1 ¾ miles of multi-use pedestrian walkway running from US 1 at Ocean Way northward to Coastal Way at the Events Plaza (located under the Indiantown Road Bridge).



The project involves clearing and grubbing, grading, construction of the Riverwalk pathway, a retaining wall, railings and lighting, and landscaping. The Town's Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA) will initially fund the \$305,000 project, and be reimbursed by the developer of the Waterpointe project. Construction is scheduled to be complete by January, 2013.

In Memory of Officer Bruce St. Laurent

End of Watch September 9, 2012



On September 9, 2012, while on duty in the Presidential Motorcade in West Palm Beach, Officer Bruce St. Laurent of the Jupiter Police Department tragically lost his life. Officer St. Laurent's funeral was attended by thousands of law enforcement personnel from around the state and the country, as well as members of the Jupiter Community.

Officer St. Laurent touched many lives, evidenced by the many tributes, donations, gifts, and wishes offered to his family and friends after the tragedy. In addition to his duties as a Jupiter Police Officer, he could often be seen with the kids at the Jupiter Head Start program, or in his Santa Suit at one of Jupiter's many holiday events.

The **Jupiter Waterway Trail** is a network of waterways that runs through the Loxahatchee River, Intracoastal Waterway and Jupiter Inlet. It has several legs and off-shoots that make it a natural playground of eco-tourism activities, from kayaking and stand-up paddleboarding to snorkeling, boating, fishing, and diving. It also has several adjacent natural areas that encourage "near-water" activities like hiking, biking, beaching and enjoying wildlife (such as bird-watching).

To promote the many natural wonders along Jupiter's natural waterways, the Town of Jupiter is developing an interactive application that will guide paddlers, boaters and nature enthusiasts along routes, natural areas and excursions. The application will let users see or create routes, learn about the area's activities, and find points of interest, such as dining, rental and touring services, and more.

Businesses involved in eco-tourism and its supporting industries can participate in the application by having their business promoted right in the application. The app should be available on iPhone and Android platforms, as well as on the web, in early 2013.

Max Planck Florida Institute Opens; Increases Academic and Scientific Reach

The 2013 New Year is poised to be an exciting one for the Max Planck Florida Institute (MPFI) – the first U.S. scientific research institute of Germany’s Max Planck Society. The new 100,000 square foot facility on Donald Ross Road will mark its official grand opening with a series of events in early December, culminating with a celebration for the general public on Saturday, December 8 from 10 a.m. – 4 p.m. Neuroscience Discovery Day will feature the wonders of neuroscience, fascinating educational programs for all ages, art, music, food and fun.

Built on six acres at Florida Atlantic University’s (FAU) John D. MacArthur Campus, the new building provides a dynamic environment for MPFI scientists and research teams. It also serves as a welcoming center for scientists around the world who come to collaborate with the scientific community at MPFI. The building includes nearly 58,000 square feet of laboratory space that houses wet- and dry-bench research, instrumentation labs, computational research, imaging facilities, microscope suites and offices for researchers and support staff. There are three research wings, including six guest labs, centrally located around a dramatic, open lobby that connects all three floors. The facility is also engineered to consume the least amount of energy possible, setting a high standard for sustainable laboratory design.

Scientists at MPFI are engaged in the ultimate challenge to better understand the mysteries of brain function. They are using innovative technologies and novel approaches to explore the functional organization of the nervous system and its capacity to produce thought, language, memory, emotion and action. This fundamental research could be the key to understanding human behaviors and offer ways to treat a host of neurological and psychiatric disorders and diseases more effectively, including Alzheimer’s, Parkinson’s, Huntington’s, autism and schizophrenia.

Moody’s Cites Jupiter’s Strong Financial Position in Upgrade of Rating to Aaa

On September 24, 2012, Moody’s Investors Service announced that it had upgraded to Aaa from Aa1 the rating on the Town of Jupiter’s Series 2001 and Series 2005 General Obligation bonds and affirmed the Aa2 rating on the town’s Series 2002 Sales Tax Revenue Refunding bonds.

In their summary, Moody’s stated, “The upgrade to Aaa on the town’s General Obligation bonds reflects the town’s favorable economic profile, large and stabilizing property tax base, low debt burden, significantly strengthened financial position and strong management.” It went on to compliment how the Town has actively managed expenditures and revenues “...not only to preserve, but also to significantly strengthen, the town’s financial position, during a period of extended, substantial pressure on general operating revenues.”

One of the major benefits of favorable bond ratings for the Town comes in the form of lower interest rates. Moody’s follows two other major ratings agencies in upgrading the Town of Jupiter to the highest level.

2012-2013 School's Out & Holiday Camp



National Mortgage Settlement

Recently, the Florida Attorney General entered into a \$25 billion joint Federal-State agreement with the nation's five largest mortgage services over foreclosure abuses and unacceptable nationwide mortgage servicing practices. Florida's share of the settlement is approximately \$8.4 billion.

Are you eligible for assistance through the National Settlement?

If you are still in your home, you may be eligible for relief through the national settlement in the form of a loan modification, short sale, deed in lieu, deficiency waiver, refinancing or other forms of relief. Contact your bank to find out if you qualify for assistance under the agreement.

Town of Jupiter Partners with Palm Beach County Community Action Service Center

The Town of Jupiter and the Palm Beach County Community Action Service Center (CAP) are working together to provide access to services in Jupiter. The services that will be available to residents at the center located at 3415 Indiantown Road are Department of Children and Families (DCF) Food Stamps, Medicare Eligibility and Cash Assistance, and federally-funded Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP).

Each day in Palm Beach County hundreds of families are faced with utility service disconnection. The Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) is designed to provide financial relief from high-energy costs to prevent service disconnection for families in crisis. LIHEAP provides electric bill assistance to clients who are eligible. Types of assistance available include:

- Home Energy Assistance: up to \$300 once every 12 months
- Crisis Benefit: up to \$600 twice a year for past due, final notice or disconnection
- Weather Related Benefit: assistance during a natural disaster
- Weatherization: assistance with weatherizing home to lower electric bill

Palm Beach County Property Appraiser in Jupiter



The Town of Jupiter welcomes the Palm Beach County Property Appraiser's Office to Jupiter Town Hall on the first Wednesday of the month through February. Representatives will be on-hand to:

- Help residents file for Homestead Exemptions
- Answer questions on existing exemptions

JUPITER TOWN HALL • 1:30PM • MAIN LOBBY

When coming to file for an exemption, please keep in mind the following guidelines:

- ★ Every person who has legal title on January 1 to a residential property and lives there permanently qualifies for this exemption. You must be a permanent resident of Florida on January 1 of the initial application year. You may either apply by mail or in person at any time through the year but the deadline is March 1 of the qualifying year.
- ★ A copy of your deed and proof of residency is required. You may submit a copy of your Florida driver's license, voter's registration or permanent residency card. In lieu of a pending permanent resident alien card, we will accept Federal Form I485, "Approval Notice for application to adjust to permanent resident status."
- ★ Exemptions available include: \$25,000 Homestead Exemption, Additional \$25,000 Homestead Exemption, Senior Citizen Exemption, \$5,000 Disabled Veterans Exemption, Combat-disabled Senior Veterans and the \$500 Widow/Widower Exemption

Help JPD reduce victim-assisted crimes by 10% this year by taking the following simple steps:

- Keep car doors locked even when unattended for short periods of time.

REPORT SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY - If you see suspicious activity, CALL 911. The MOST important thing YOU can do is CALL THE POLICE to report a CRIME or any SUSPICIOUS activity.

"Suspicious Activity" includes:

- Persons walking up and down the street and/or parking lots looking into cars or trying door handles.
- Vehicles cruising the street and/or parking lots at very slow speeds for extended periods while observing parked cars or residences.
- Persons making any kind of mark or placing anything on parked vehicles.
- Persons sitting in running parked cars for prolonged periods, and vehicles dropping one person off while continuing to cruise the same area.
