Jupiter Riverwalk and East Coast Greenway "Connect"

East Coast Greenway Designation Adds Local Pathway to a 3,000-mile Trail System

On Saturday, October 22, 2011, members of the East Coast Greenway and the Town of Jupiter connected to join the Riverwalk to the East Coast Greenway. The Greenway, which is a continuous, 3,000 mile trail that extends from Maine to Key West, was formed in 1991. Future routes will add another 2,000 miles to the trail system, which runs along waterways, through parks and natural areas, abandoned railroad corridors, and highway pathways.

"Riverwalk and the East Coast Greenway are a perfect match," said Jupiter Mayor Karen Golonka. "Becoming part of a Maine-to-Key-West connection furthers the Riverwalk vision of providing recreation and enjoyment along our waterfront, whether by foot, cycle or boat," she added.

The vision of the Jupiter Riverwalk is a 2.5 mile waterfront pathway running from Jupiter Ridge Natural Area northward along the Intracoastal to the Jupiter Inlet. Today, over a mile of Riverwalk is complete, meandering through residential, shopping and natural areas. 

Do Your Exercise Routine in the Great Outdoors!

Later this year, the Town will be installing outdoor exercise equipment at the Community Center and Indian Creek Park. The equipment stations provide cardiovascular and resistance training using an individual's self-weight. Each piece is specifically designed for a particular exercise and a short course will be designed at each location. The courses will be a valuable and healthy addition to our community parks.

Alternate A1A Landscaping Project to Begin

Now that the six-lane widening project is complete along Alternate A1A, a project to install trees and landscape on Alternate A1A from Donald Ross Road to Toney Penna Boulevard will begin this January. After a significant planning and design effort, a design by local landscape architects Gentile Holloway O'Mahoney & Associates will be installed to beautify the area for residents and businesses for many years to come.

The effort is part of a long-term effort to establish an integrated plan for landscaped medians along the major arterial roads in the Town. This project is the last of the five major roadways in the Town to be improved. Other major roadway medians and rights of way that were part of this overall landscaping plan are US Highway One, Military Trail, Indiantown Road, and Central Boulevard.

Plant and tree species for the project were selected for their drought tolerance, pest and disease resistance and low maintenance characteristics. With the completion of the project along Alternate A1A, the "greening-up" of Jupiter's major roadways will be complete in a way that is uniquely Jupiter!

In 2011, the Town's Engineering, Parks and Public Works Department launched an Adopt a Street, Adopt a Park Program. to conduct a quarterly clean-up or minor improvement project for the adopted area. Removal of Exotics Planned for Jupiter Inlet Lighthouse Outstanding Natural Area

In early 2012, Palm Beach County Department of Environmental Resources Management will begin Phase I of a Restoration Project to control invasive, exotic plant species at the Jupiter Inlet Lighthouse Outstanding Natural Area (JILONA).

Phase I will involve work to remove exotics on approximately 14.5 acres of the site. Primarily, species to be removed will include Brazilian pepper, Australian pine, Old World climbing fern, woman's tongue, carrotwood, Queensland umbrella tree and earleaf acacia. Phase II and III of the project is planned for 2013.

The Jupiter Inlet Lighthouse and its surrounding 126 acres of natural area were designated an "Outstanding Natural Area" by President George Bush on May 8, 2008. The designation makes the beloved Palm Beach County icon and its surrounding lands part of the National Landscape Conservation System managed by the Bureau of Land Management, and is the first and only lighthouse with such a designation east of the Mississippi. The JILONA site contains many protected plant and animal species, and this exotic removal effort is part of an overall management plan involving local, county, state and federal agencies.



Discounted Flood Insurance

A NFIP Class 6 Community



The annual premium savings for thousands of Jupiter flood insurance policy holders will top \$450,073 in 2012 following news that the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has upgraded the Town of Jupiter's Community Rating System (CRS) standing.

FEMA has categorized the Town of Jupiter as a Class 6 community – an improvement of one grade from its previous rating. As a result, nearly 6,100 flood insurance policy holders inside Jupiter's high risk 100-year floodplain areas (SFHA) will save \$65 per year (previous savings were \$49 per year). Insured properties in high-risk areas (see map) are already saving 15% on annual premiums due to the Town's previous ranking as a Class 7 community. The improved rating raises the annual savings for this group from just over \$297,573 to \$396,769.

Meanwhile, another 942 policy holders in low-to-moderate risk areas will save the maximum discount of 10% on their annual flood insurance premiums. Previously, these insured properties were receiving a 5% discount. All Jupiter flood insurance policy holders will be notified of their savings during their next policy renewal cycle.

FEMA's Community Rating System is a voluntary incentive program that encourages community floodplain management activities that exceed FEMA's minimum requirements. Communities can receive discounts when they take measures to reduce flood losses, facilitate accurate insurance ratings and promote the awareness of flood insurance availability. 

8-Week Summer Youth Camp

Summer Camp is designed for children ages 6-13 and covers an 8-week period of the summer break for Palm Beach County Schools. Camp is held at the Jupiter Community Center for four separate age groups (6-7, 8-9, 10-11 and 12-13) and age-appropriate activities are scheduled to provide a fun and exciting summer for your child. Camp activities may include team sports, group games, game room activities, board games, movies, craft projects, cooking projects, guest presentations, off-site field trips and more. Weekly activities are split between both on-site and off-site activities. A typical week at summer camp will include 2 days of all day, off-site field trips; one day of a 1/2 day field trip and 1/2 day at the Community Center; 2 full days at the Community Center. **8-Week Summer Camp:** June 18 - August 10, 2012 (individual weeks not available).

Camp Hours: 9:00 am - 4:00 pm.

Before & After Care Option: Drop off no earlier than 7:30 am and pick up no later than 6:00 pm; \$130.

8-Week Camp Fee: \$600 covers staffing, field trip transportation, 5 camper t-shirts and supplies for entire duration of camp. Individual days or weeks may not be purchased; you must register for the entire 8-week camp. **Fee does not include activity fees.**

Payment: Fees are due in full at time of registration. A payment plan option is available for those registering multiple children from the same family (half of total fee due at time of registration; second half due on or before Friday, May 4, 2012. Failure to meet second payment deadline may result in loss of space in the camp). Fees may be paid by cash, check, Visa, Master Card or American Express. Please contact Kristin George at 741-2328 with any questions regarding payment.

REGISTRATION DETAILS

Open Registration Period: Friday, March 2 - Saturday, March 17, 2012

Anyone meeting the residency and age requirements that registers within this two week open registration period is guaranteed placement into the camp. Due to the popularity of this camp and facility limitations, registration is only available for residents of incorporated Jupiter, ages 6-13.

Mandatory Registration Requirements: The following documents must be presented at the time of registration (NO EXCEPTIONS will be made for these requirements, even if the child has attended previous 2011 or 2012 youth camps):

- Birth certificate for each child: if your child has registered for previous programs at the Community Center, a birth certificate is not required; campers must turn 6 years of age on or prior to August 10, 2012 in order to be eligible; campers may not be older than 13 years old prior to June 18, 2012.

- Two (2) forms of proof of incorporated Jupiter residency: this includes Florida driver's license with incorporated Jupiter address AND a 2012 utility, land line phone, cable or tax bill with name and address matching driver's license. Address on license and bill must match and be incorporated Jupiter addresses.

Age Group Placement: All campers will be placed in a specific age group based upon their date of birth (6-7, 8-9, 10-11 or 12-13). Only those campers with birthdays falling within the camp dates who would be eligible to advance to the next age group will have their choice of group placement. If you have a specific request regarding placement with or non-placement with another camper in your child's age group, you will have the opportunity to make that request at the time of registration (maximum 2 campers per request). All efforts will be made to accommodate requests but cannot be guaranteed due to the large number of campers in each age group. Requests will not be granted after May 4, 2012.

Refund Policy: (Please read carefully!)

- A \$50 per child non-refundable administrative fee will apply to any refunds requested after the open registration period ends on March 17, 2012.
- In addition to the administrative fee, pro-rated refunds will only be available for the 8-week camp through June 29, 2012.
- Refunds for the 8-week camp will not be available once the third week of camp begins (July 2, 2012).

2012 Matching Grant Program Your Neighborhood May Be Eligible for Money!

Applications for the 2012 Town of Jupiter Neighborhood Grants will be available online the first week of February, 2012 and will be due March 16, 2012. A workshop to discuss the grant criteria will be held on February 9, 2012 at 6:30 p.m. at the Jupiter Community Center. Communities who send at least one representative to the workshop will receive an additional 10 points towards their application. HOA property managers representing a community will NOT receive the bonus points. Communities that were awarded a Matching or Distress Grant within the previous three years are not eligible to apply in 2012.

Communities will be able to apply for two different grants:


Community Building, \$250

Create, diversify, or increase participation in a community, neighborhood-based association or organization that benefits the neighborhood (communities are allowed to submit applications for this grant along with a neighborhood improvement grant).

Neighborhood Improvement, \$1,000 - \$5,000 (1 for 1 community match required)

A combination of cash and in-kind support will be accepted. Maximum in-kind contribution will 50% of the community's portion of the grant; a minimum of 50% financial support is required.
