


Town Dedicates New State-of-the-Art Nanofiltration Water Treatment Facility

With well over 100 guests, Mayor Karen Golonka and members of the Jupiter Town Council dedicated the Town's new, state-of-the-art nanofiltration water treatment facility on December 15, 2010. The facility, unique in its energy-saving design and environmentally friendly functions, has been constructed to replace an aging conventional treatment plant located on Central Boulevard. The new system operates in tandem with the Town's existing reverse osmosis desalination system to produce 30 million gallons per day of ultra-pure drinking water for Jupiter Utilities customers in Northern Palm Beach and Southern Martin Counties.



How Membrane Technology Works



With the addition of the nanofiltration plant, all of Jupiter's water is now treated with membrane technology, considered by the Environmental Protection Agency as one of the best available technologies to meet current and future drinking water quality challenges. Membrane water treatment technology removes unwanted microscopic compounds and contaminants from the raw water as it is pressurized and forced through a semi-permeable membrane. Testing performed on the finished water produced by the facility shows how effective it is in removing potentially harmful contaminants in the region's ground water supply.

Jupiter's new nanofiltration plant also has two very "green" attributes. Being a very environmentally conscious community, Jupiter designed the new system to minimize energy use and maximize the use of precious water resources. Three years of pilot testing of treatment designs resulted in a 30% reduction in electricity needed to operate the nanofiltration process compared to conventional designs. This will save Jupiter's customers over \$100,000 per year in energy expenses.



Second, the Town wanted to ensure that no water was wasted in the treatment process. Normally, nearly 15% of the raw water entering a plant would have to be wasted or disposed of at a cost. Instead, Jupiter was able to develop a contract with the Loxahatchee River District to purchase by-product water for purposes of irrigation. The by-product water from the nanofiltration process supplements LRD's existing wastewater reuse system – a "win-win" for all living in the region including the local environment.

David Brown, Jupiter's Utilities Director, noted that, "This project is an example of how a community can maintain sustainability through careful planning. Three-fourths of the total project cost of \$45 million was available from the reserves Jupiter's utility customers have accumulated over the past several decades." The remaining 25% of the project's cost is to be funded by future customers as they connect to the system.

Therefore, construction of this new facility has caused little, if any, rate impact. Jupiter's customers can enjoy the benefits of this new state-of-the-art treatment system while maintaining rates that are 19% less than the average charged by other utilities throughout Palm Beach, Martin and St. Lucie Counties.

Making Jupiter Transit-Ready



On November 15, 2010, over 80 residents attended a meeting in person and live online to learn about potential transit station locations in the Town. Dana Little from the Treasure Coast Regional Planning Council (TCRPC) presented a summary of the studies and analysis that have been done on bringing transit to north county on the Florida East Coast (FEC) railroad corridor.

Proposed station locations, which are based on a study conducted by Florida's Department of Transportation (the South Florida East Coast Corridor (SFECC) Study) and a Transit-Oriented Development (TOD) Charrette held by Jupiter in January, 2008 are listed below.

Proposed Station Locations:

- Indiantown Road
- Toney Penna Drive
- One of either Frederick Small Road or Donald Ross Road

Both the TOD Charrette and SFECC Study included a public input process. The SFECC Study proposes that Tri-Rail be extended north to Jupiter, beyond its current end-of-line at Mangonia Park. This would require passenger service on the FEC freight tracks for the first time since the 1960's. This means that the proposed Indiantown Road station would be an end of the line local park-and-ride station. The station at Toney Penna Drive would be considered a "town center station", serving Jupiter Medical Center and encouraging redevelopment in the surrounding area.

CRA Implementation Plan

In February 2010, the Town of Jupiter Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA) began working with Planning and Redevelopment Consultants, Inc. to draft an Implementation Plan for the CRA. The purpose of the plan is to create a roadmap of projects and programs for the CRA, and suggest plans for implementing the Community Redevelopment Plan (CRP). It will also help to identify any additional projects or programs that would benefit the CRA and the Town.

In April, 2010, public input meetings were held to gather input from residents and businesses on the future of the CRA. In early 2011, a presentation of the findings and the proposed Implementation Plan will take place during a regular CRA Commission meeting. Demolition of Building on Municipal Complex

This month, residents will notice some significant demolition on the Town's municipal complex. At the corner of Military Trail and Indiantown Road, the former Lifesong Church sanctuary, damaged in the hurricanes of 2004, will be demolished.

The Lifesong Church and adjacent property was purchased by the Town in November of 2005 for purposes of future expansion of the municipal complex. Because the Town has no immediate plans for use of the sanctuary building, the cost of safely removing the structure is much less than the investment to repair the building for safe use.

The Town has contracted with Miami Wrecking Company to raze the existing structure and grade and sod the existing site. Residents can expect to see work begin in January, 2011 and complete by the end of March.

Standard & Poor's Upgrades Jupiter's Bond Rating to AAA

On November 22, 2010, Standard & Poor's Rating Services announced it would raise its rating on the Town of Jupiter's outstanding general obligation (GO) bonds to 'AAA' from 'AA+'. S&P stated the following reasons for upgrading the rating:

- The Town's above-average income and wealth indicators combined with the Town's solid and conservative fiscal management practices;
- Consistently strong fund balance levels, including the Town's internal goal of maintaining a fund balance of at least 25% of the operating budget for the previous year;
- A favorable debt profile combined with a manageable five-year Community Investment Program (CIP) that does not require future GO bond issues.

The announcement goes on to explain that the Town's recent reductions in personnel, compensation and operating costs have helped to offset declining revenues without sacrificing critical services for residents.

An increase in the Town's bond rating, particularly in times of economic recession and declining property values, greatly enhances the Town's financial reputation. High ratings also translate into lower interest rates should the Town ever need to issue additional bonds. Based on these ratings, Jupiter taxpayers should feel comfortable that their Town and its finances are being handled with fiscal responsibility and care.



8-Week Summer Youth Camp

Summer camp is designed for children ages 6-13 and covers an 8-week period of the summer break for Palm Beach County Schools. Camp is held at the Jupiter Community Center for four separate age groups (6-7, 8-9, 10-11 and 12-13) and age-appropriate activities are scheduled to provide a fun and exciting summer for your child. Camp activities may include team sports, group games, game room activities, board games, movies, craft projects, cooking projects, guest presentations, off-site field trips and more. Weekly activities are split between both on-site and off-site activities. A typical week at summer camp will include 2 days of all day, off-site field trips; one day of a 1/2 day field trip and 1/2 day at the Community Center; 2 full days at the Community Center.

8-Week Summer Camp: June 13 - August 5, 2011 (individual weeks not available)

Camp Hours: 9:00 am - 4:00 pm

Before & After Care Option: Drop off no earlier than 7:30 am and pick up no later than 6:00 pm; \$130

8-Week Camp Fee: \$600 covers staffing, field trip transportation, 5 camper t-shirts and supplies for entire duration of camp. Individual days or weeks may not be purchased; you must register for the entire 8-week camp. **Fee does not include activity fees.**

Payment: Fees are due in full at time of registration. A payment plan option is available for those registering multiple children from the same family (half of total fee due at time of registration; second half due on or before Friday, April, 29, 2011. Failure to meet second payment deadline may result in loss of space in the camp). Fees may be paid by cash, check, Visa, MasterCard or American Express. REGISTRATION DETAILS

Open Registration Period: Friday, February 25 - Saturday, March 12, 2011

Anyone meeting the residency and age requirements that registers within this two week open registration period is guaranteed placement into the camp. Due to the popularity of this camp and facility limitations, registration is only available for residents of incorporated Jupiter, ages 6-13. **Mandatory Registration Requirements:** The following documents must be presented at the time of registration (NO EXCEPTIONS will be made for these requirements, even if the child has attended previous 2010 or 2011 youth camps):

- Birth certificate for each child: if your child has registered for previous programs at the Community Center, a birth certificate is not required; campers must turn 6 years of age on or prior to August 5, 2011 in order to be eligible; campers may not be older than 13 years old prior to June 13, 2011.

- Two (2) forms of proof of incorporated Jupiter residency: this includes Florida driver's license with incorporated Jupiter address AND a 2011 utility, land line phone, cable or tax bill with name and address matching driver's license. Address on license and bill must match and be incorporated Jupiter addresses.

Age Group Placement: All campers will be placed in a specific age group based upon their date of birth (6-7, 8-9, 10-11 or 12-13). Only those campers with birthdays falling within the camp dates who would be eligible to advance to the next age group will have their choice of group placement. If you have a specific request regarding placement with or non-placement with another camper in your child's age group, you will have the opportunity to make that request at the time of registration (maximum 2 campers per request). All efforts will be made to accommodate requests but cannot be guaranteed due to the large number of campers in each age group. Requests will not be granted after May 1, 2011.

Refund Policy: (Please read carefully!)

- A \$50 per child non-refundable administrative fee will apply to any refunds requested after the open registration period ends on March 12, 2011.
- In addition to the administrative fee, pro-rated refunds will only be available for the 8-week camp through June 24, 2011.
- Refunds for the 8-week camp will not be available once the third week of camp begins (June 25, 2011).

Morse Museum of American Art, Winter Park, FL January 26, 2011

Downtown Winter Park's charm is in its distinctive details: hidden gardens and side streets home to unique stores and restaurants. The Morse Museum houses the world's most comprehensive collection of works by Louis Comfort Tiffany, including art glass, leaded-glass windows, lamps, and his 1893 chapel interior. 

Jupiter's First "Green" Playground Coming Spring 2011



During the spring of 2011, the Town of Jupiter will introduce its first eco-friendly recycled playground at Indian Creek Park, current home of the Imagination Station playground.

Imagination Station, a large wooden playground, has served as one of Jupiter's most popular children's play areas for over 17 years. The unique playground was constructed over a four-day period in April 1993. The names of volunteers who helped with construction are inscribed on the boards of the wooden fence surrounding the playground. Through the years, Imagination Station has deteriorated due to its wooden construction, which has a lifespan of approximately 15 years. Several maintenance and safety issues have resulted in the need to replace the playground with a more durable and safe play area for the children of Jupiter.



In an effort to increase the Town's environmental stewardship, a new "green" recycled playground will replace Imagination Station in the spring of 2011. "Eco-Island" is the name that has been selected for the new playground and was chosen from over 40 submissions by the students at Jerry Thomas Elementary School. In addition, students from the 3rd-5th grade classes submitted drawings from which a new logo was compiled for the playground. At the request of Jupiter's residents, the playground will offer additional shade components. Nearly double the life expectancy of wooden structures can be expected from a playground built with recycled materials. The cost of building this new playground is \$150,000; a pending state grant, if awarded, will pay \$112,500 towards the construction. The Town expects demolition of the Imagination Station structure to be complete by mid-February and the new playground to be in place by March 2011. Plans are in place to create an opportunity for which volunteers who were involved in the construction of Imagination Station can claim their name planks from the park.

Russell Ruskay, Jupiter's Director of Business Development states, "Having been involved with the

community participation and initial construction of Imagination Station, I have mixed feelings about its demolition. However, building an environmentally friendly playground in Jupiter can act not only as a source of safe fun and entertainment, but also as an educational tool teaching children the importance and relevancy of experiencing and protecting our environment."
