

## Jupiter Utilities Nearing Completion on New Nanofiltration Water Treatment Plant



If you've driven by the Jupiter water plant on Central Boulevard recently, you've probably noticed some significant changes. Rising up from the construction over the last few months is a very sophisticated, state-of-the-art water treatment facility that will go online in Spring, 2010 – about 6 months ahead of schedule and under budget.

What is so special about the new water treatment plant? It's called Nanofiltration Membrane Water Treatment, and it will complement the existing Reverse Osmosis water treatment method to ensure the best possible drinking water quality for Jupiter. The new technology will help Jupiter's utility continue to achieve best-in-class water quality, and meet strict future guidelines set by the EPA.

In addition, the new facility will bring Jupiter's daily water production capacity to 30 million gallons per day. Funding for the facility came through connection fees, renewal and replacement reserves, and debt. It will allow Jupiter to utilize the best available treatment technologies to maintain our community water supply and the local environment.

Jupiter's water treatment plant has been recognized by the EPA during three of the past 10 years as being the best large ground water treatment system in the entire Southeastern United States. The new Nanofiltration facility will help to ensure that level of performance and drinking water quality for many years to come.

## Town Of Jupiter Municipal Election

The Town of Jupiter General Election will be held on Tuesday, March 9, 2010 for the following three seats:

**Mayor Seat** – three year term – Candidate must live in Jupiter

**North District Seat** – three year term – Candidate must live in the North District

**South District Seat** – three year term – Candidate must live in the South District

All candidates shall be elected by the voters of the Town at large. If a run-off election is necessary, it will be held on Tuesday, March 23, 2010.

## NEW PARKING REGULATIONS FOR THE TOWN’S NEIGHBORHOODS

In August, the Jupiter Town Council approved changes to the Town’s parking regulations that limit the time a vehicle may remain parked in the same place. Effective February 18, 2010, vehicles may remain parked in residential and mixed use public roadways for a continuous 24-hour period before being considered a violation. In designated parking areas, vehicles may remain for 72 hours. In addition, recreational vehicles and semi-trucks will not be permitted to park overnight in on-street parking spaces, public roadways, or public rights-of-way.

This means that there will be a 24-hour limit on how long a car, including a boat and trailer, may be parked in a non-marked space. There will also be a 3-day time limit on how long you can leave a vehicle in an on-street parking space. However, at no time may a car or other vehicle hinder or obstruct the normal use of a roadway in the Town.

The effective date of the ordinance is not until February of 2010, in order to give residents plenty of notice to comply. The Police Department is not able to constantly patrol for violations, but will be responding to calls. If you have a problem in your neighborhood, your first call should be to your management company representative, who will try to solve the problem locally between neighbors and within associations. However, the new regulations will provide an additional tool for associations and the police department for correcting problem situation.



### Smoke Detector Safety:

#### A Message from Palm Beach County Fire Rescue

Did you change the battery in your smoke detector last October with the time change? Do you remember the last time you checked your smoke detector?

It’s recommended that you check your smoke detector every month. The smoke detector gives early notification of a fire and is especially important if a fire occurs while you are sleeping. To test for proper operation, just push the button on the front of the unit. Have your family listen so they will be familiar with the alarm and know to leave the home when alarms.

## 8-Week Summer Youth Camp

Summer camp is designed for children ages 6-13 and encompasses an 8-week period of summer break from Palm Beach County Schools. Four separate age groups (6-7, 8-9, 10-11 and 12-13) are offered, with age-appropriate activities scheduled to ensure a fun and exciting summer for your child. Camp activities may include team sports, group games, game room activities, board games, movies, craft projects, cooking projects, guest presentations, off-site field trips and more. Camp takes place each summer at the Jupiter Community Center, located at 200 Military Trail. Weekly activities will be split between both on-site and off-site activities. A typical week at summer camp will include 2 days of all day, off-site field trips; one day of a 1/2 day field trip and 1/2 day at the Community Center; and 2 full days at the Community Center. 2010 details are as follows:

**8-WEEK SUMMER CAMP DATES-** June 14-August 6, 2010 (individual weeks not available)

**CAMP HOURS -** 9:00 AM-4:00 PM

**BEFORE & AFTER CARE OPTION-** May drop off no earlier than 7:45 AM and pick up no later than 5:30 PM (additional fee applies)

**8-WEEK CAMP FEE-** \$600 (this fee covers staffing, field trip transportation, 5 camper t-shirts and supplies for entire duration of camp); not able to purchase individual days or weeks; must register for entire 8-Week Camp; fee does not include activity fees.

**BEFORE & AFTER CARE FEE-** \$120; Before and After Care can be purchased at any time prior to the start of camp; cannot purchase individual days or weeks; Before and After Care is for entire 8-Week Camp.

**PAYMENT-** Fees are due in full at time of registration. A payment plan option is available for those registering multiple children from the same family (half of total fee due at time of registration; second half due on or before Friday, April, 23 2010; failure to meet second payment deadline may result in loss of space in the camp; fees may be paid by cash, check, Visa, Master Card or American Express; please contact Kristin George at 741-2328 with any questions regarding payment.

### REGISTRATION DETAILS

**OPEN REGISTRATION PERIOD - Friday, February 26-Saturday, March 13, 2010**

Anyone who meets the residency and age requirements that registers within this two week open registration period is guaranteed placement into the camp. Due to the popularity of this camp and facility limitations, registration is only available for residents of incorporated Jupiter, ages 6-13.

**MANDATORY REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS-** You will not be permitted to register for the Youth Camp without presenting these documents at the time of registration (NO EXCEPTIONS will be made for these requirements, even if your child has attended any other 2009 or 2010 youth camps):

- All new participants must present a birth certificate at registration for each child; if your child has registered for previous programs at the Community Center, a birth certificate is not required; campers must turn 6 years of age prior to August 6, 2010 in order to be eligible; campers may not be older than 13 years old prior to June 14, 2010.
- (2) two forms of proof of incorporated Jupiter residency will be required at time of registration; this includes Florida driver's license with incorporated Jupiter address AND a 2010 utility, land line phone, cable or tax bill with name and address matching driver's license.

**AGE GROUP PLACEMENT-** All campers will be placed in a specific age group based upon their date of birth (6-7, 8-9, 10-11 or 12-13). Only those campers with birthdays falling within the camp dates who would be eligible to advance to the next age group will have their choice of group placement. If you have a specific request regarding placement with or non-placement with another camper in your child's age group, you will have the opportunity to make that request at the time of registration. All efforts will be made to accommodate these requests but they cannot be guaranteed due to the large number of campers in each age group. Requests made after the open registration period cannot be granted.

**REFUND POLICY:** (Please read carefully!)

- A \$50 per child non-refundable administrative fee will apply to any refunds requested for this camp after the Open Registration period ends on March 13, 2010.
- In addition to the administrative fee, pro-rated refunds will only be available for the 8-week camp through June 25, 2010.
- Refunds for the 8-week camp will not be available once the third week of camp begins (June 25, 2010)
