## Introducing... Sherlock

On Tuesday, August 3rd, the Jupiter Police Department officially introduced the newest member of its force – K9 Sherlock. Going temporarily by the name “Unit 111,” Sherlock’s name was selected by popular public vote from a list of finalists - Hunter, Scout, Sherlock, Watson and Trapper – and it was a close match. In the end, though, the favorite won out and “Unit 111” was finally named by Chief Frank Kitzerow and an audience assistant at National Night Out at the Riverwalk Events Plaza.



Sherlock was donated to the Department by the Jimmy Ryce Center for Victims of Predatory Abduction. Sherlock will be a tremendous asset in locating lost children and with assisting officers and C.E.R.T. members in the location of missing Alzheimer’s patients, tracking of criminals, as well as school educational programs.

## Jupiter Inlet Village... OPEN FOR BUSINESS



This summer, three new businesses join restaurants, hotels and other established businesses in Jupiter’s Inlet Village area – the area along the north end of A1A where much of Jupiter’s history and heritage began.

**Blueline Stand Up Paddle Surf** shop opened its doors on July 7th to become the area’s first purely retail establishment. Bringing their stand up paddle surf (or “SUP”) expertise all the way from Santa Barbara, California, Blueline offers boards in all categories of the sport. Their location across from **Guanabanas** popular outdoor eatery is perfect for offering demos on nearby waterways.

For those who prefer powered recreation for cruising the inlet and beach areas of Jupiter, **Indian Motorcycle** also opened its doors in the Village this summer. And **Day Boats Commercial Fishing** has also put down their lines in Inlet Village, operating their boats out of the beautiful Jupiter Inlet and supplying local restaurants with fresh seafood.

These three new businesses join a host of popular businesses already serving locals and visitors. Restaurants like **Schooners, Castaways, Jetty’s, Guanabana’s, Brix,** and the **Crab House**; recreation businesses like the **Jupiter Outdoor Center** and **Jupiter Inlet Boat Rentals**; places to stay like **Baron’s Landing** and **Pa-Ja Motel**; and a host of other service and retail businesses.

It’s easier than ever to visit Inlet Village – by land or by sea. There is plenty of accessible, public parking in the lot just north of Schooners, and new, public docks at the **Inlet Village Marina** (next to Guanabana’s) opened in August. And, through a \$1.5 million grant from the Metropolitan Planning Organization, A1A will be reconstructed beginning in Spring of 2013 to better accommodate pedestrians and bicyclists and vehicular traffic too!

### Jupiter’s Business Connection for Local Business Development & Support

Jupiter’s local economy is driven by a diverse business community and growing opportunities for employment. From large bio-science and high-tech companies to small-town businesses and services, Jupiter offers a unique combination of marketplace opportunity and quality of life for business leaders and their employees.

This fall, Jupiter will launch **JBiz** – a program to support Jupiter’s existing and future businesses by connecting them with local government, other agencies, valuable resources, and networking opportunities that will help them succeed.

Registered businesses in Jupiter can get a free listing in this directory simply by creating an online business registration account with the Town, and having a valid business license.

For the first time, the Jupiter Jubilee will include a Local Business Fair, where local businesses can purchase booth space and educate residents and visitors about their products and services. Also, the Jubilee offers sponsorship opportunities at many different levels for local businesses to reach the 5,000+ attendees each year. The 2011 Jubilee will be held on Saturday, February 5th at the Jupiter Community Center.

## Fiscal Year 2011 Budget Lunch ‘n Learn

On August 5 at the Jupiter Community Center, Jupiter held a unique lunchtime input session for residents to learn about and ask questions on the Fiscal Year 2011 proposed budget. Participants attended both in-person at the Community Center and live online via web conference, where they were able to chat-in questions for Town Council and staff to answer.

**Key highlights of the FY 2011 budget proposal** were discussed, including:

- The proposed fiscal year 2011 budget assumes the same millage rate as fiscal year 2010, or 2.5142, excluding debt (additional millage for voter-approved debt is 0.2904).
- Fiscal year 2011’s budget proposal assumes a continued reduction in property values of 8%. Because of this reduction in taxable values, many residents may experience a reduction in the dollar amount of taxes they pay to the Town of Jupiter, even if the tax rate remains the same.

Approximately 13% of a Jupiter resident’s tax bill is made up of taxes paid to the Town.

- The Town’s total budget for 2011 is proposed at \$78.5 million, and is made up of six different funds: the General Fund, Water Fund, Stormwater Fund, Building Fund, Debt Service Funds, and the Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA).
- The General Fund portion of the overall budget is \$39.7 million, and a portion of the General Fund is supported by property taxes. In 2011, property tax revenues are expected to decline from \$20.5 million in 2010 to \$19.3 million.
- Through process improvements, cost and staff reductions, and a restructuring of the organization, staffing levels will be reduced by 8.5 positions in fiscal year 2011 across all funds. This brings the Town’s five-year total reduction in staffing to 58 positions, or 14%.



- Financial planning continues to focus on sustainability for short and long-term economic realities. These include planning for a shift from new development to redevelopment; little to no growth in key markets such as housing and construction; and an investment in local business to create a more diversified tax base.

## Jupiter's History Corner

### HISTORIC JUPITER INLET U.S. LIFESAVING STATION, 1885-1899




In 1885, the only United States Life-Saving Station on the Florida East Coast was built near the current site of the Loggerhead Café in Carlin Park. Charles R. Carlin, a former British sailor and Assistant Keeper at the Jupiter Inlet Lighthouse, oversaw construction and served as the Station's Keeper. The two-story facility housed men and rescue equipment, including a 27-foot self-bailing surf boat, a Lyle Gun, and a Breeches Buoy apparatus used to transfer people and cargo from ships in distress. The Station, highly regarded for its efficiency in sea rescues, was manned September through April by six uniformed Surfmen, who were quartered on the second floor. During the summer only the Keeper was on duty. The Surfmen drilled, stood watch in the tower, patrolled the beach, maintained equipment, and trained as medics. The Keeper's detailed logs recorded rescues, weather details, patrol duties, and daily activities at the Station. With the completion of Henry Flagler's Florida East Coast Railroad and the decline in sailing ships, the paid crew was replaced with local volunteers. Carlin remained caretaker until his death in 1912. At the advent of World War I, the Life-Saving Service merged with the Revenue Cutter Service to create the United States Coast Guard.

A Florida Historical Marker commemorating the Jupiter Inlet Life Saving Station will be placed near the flagpole in front of the Loggerhead Café later this year. Jupiter is one of more than 10,000 communities throughout all 50 states, U.S. territories, Canada and military bases worldwide who were participating. The purpose of National Night Out was to heighten crime and drug prevention awareness, generate support for and participation in, local anti-crime efforts while strengthening neighborhood spirit and police-community partnerships. Your attendance helped to send a clear message to the criminal element that our neighborhoods are organized and that we will fight back against their attempts to commit crimes in our town.

The Jupiter Police Department would like to remind you that we can't do it alone, we need your help. What can you do to improve our community? There are countless ways to help the Jupiter Police do its job, and you can help by volunteering. The Jupiter Police Department's Community Emergency Response Team (CERT), comprised of 118 volunteers, was established in 2007, and has already contributed over 3,200 hours since its inception. Trained volunteers conduct patrol operations in specially marked vehicles and are a force multiplier for our agency, providing extra sets of eyes and ears in the field. They assist in handing out educational literature to the public in problem areas and provide local assistance during both major emergencies and smaller events. CERT members assist in searching for missing persons, including lost Alzheimer's and autistic persons. They also conduct disaster preparedness training, such as basic disaster response skills. They are utilized in light search and rescue, disaster medical operations, and damage assessment. CERT is an integral part of the Town of Jupiter's Incident Command System and Emergency Response Plan. Our CERT program is utilized extensively in the development of the patrol mission at the command level. Early evaluations report this program is having a positive effect on community policing efforts and the overall crime rate. We recognize the valuable assistance that volunteers provide, and consider them as an integral part of our team. 
