Inlet Village Taking Shape

In 2013, the Town's Inlet Village area, located primarily along A1A from US1 to Jupiter Beach Road, will see some significant changes and enhancements. The old Seasport Marina, the Love Street properties between A1A and the inlet (including the municipal parking lot), the A1A roadway and an area of land toward the south end of the village will see enhancements and new uses that will help the village continue to take shape and become a destination where families can enjoy restaurants, shopping, charter fishing, diving, and entertainment along Jupiter's beautiful inlet.

The A1A roadway and the utilities along it are approximately 50 years old and at the end of their life cycle. The reconstruction of the roadway will be done in two phases, with the first beginning in late summer of 2013. Phase one will include replacement of old utilities, installation of a master storm water system and undergrounding of overhead utilities. Phase two, which will begin in spring, 2014, will include the installation of bike lanes, sidewalks, cross walks, street lights, street trees and landscape enhancements. The project is expected to cost just over \$5 million, and is funded by the Jupiter Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA) with grant funding from the Federal Highways Administration.

In late 2012, the Seasport Marina was demolished, and construction on a new restaurant and marina facility began. The new marina will offer dry and wet slips, public dockage, a ship store and a fuel dock. The restaurant will have a style and character in keeping with the Inlet Village's and Florida's laid-back style, and offer indoor and outdoor dining.

Just south of Bubba Gump's, plans for a mixed use commercial development are in the works. The proposed development would create a "Main Street" from A1A to the Inlet, and would include retail shops, offices, restaurants, parking, an event venue, and commercial and day docks. While still in the planning stages, feedback on the project has been positive and the developer expects to submit formal plans in January or February of 2013. If the project proceeds, additional public parking will be added throughout the inlet Village.

Plans for a mini-golf complex have also been proposed to the Town, which will offer fun family recreation within the Inlet Village. The proposed business would be located on a vacant parcel just north of Jupiter Beach Road.

During the construction of these projects the entire Inlet Village area will be open for business. As you visit the businesses and restaurants already established in the Village, you'll be able to see a vibrant area take shape that will offer recreational opportunities, enjoyment of the waterfront, and entertainment for Jupiter residents and their visitors.

How to Navigate Roundabouts

Whether you call it a roundabout, a traffic circle, or a rotary, you've probably found yourself wondering if you are correctly navigating these "street circles" correctly, and why they even exist.

What are they, and why do they exist?


A Roundabout is a one-way circular intersection without a traffic signal in which traffic flows around a center island. There are yield controls at the entry points, and vehicles within the roundabout are given priority. Roundabouts move traffic safely and efficiently through an intersection, and help to slow traffic, reduce pollution, reduce the severity of accidents, and give drivers more time to judge and react to other vehicles and pedestrians. Typical signage on a roundabout or traffic circle is shown in the illustration to the right.

How should I behave in a roundabout?

According to the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), here are some recommended strategies for successfully making your way through roundabouts:

Cars:

- Determine where you want to go, and approach the roundabout as you would a typical four-way intersection.
- Many roundabouts have a splitter island (a small island at the approach/exit). Stay to the right of the island and SLOW DOWN to 10-15 mph. **NEVER** turn left at the splitter island.
- If you are making a right turn, you should be in the right lane; if you are making a left turn, you should be in the left lane; through movements can be made from either lane.
- Watch for bicyclists and allow for them to merge into the entry lane.
- Watch for and yield to pedestrians in the crosswalk or waiting to cross.
- YIELD to traffic already in the roundabout.
- Once you are in the roundabout, do not stop except to avoid a collision; you have the right-of-way over entering traffic. Travel in a counterclockwise direction. **DO NOT CHANGE LANES.**
- Look for your exit street, use your right turn signal and exit the roundabout, watching for and yielding to pedestrians and bicyclists.
- If you miss your street, simply travel around the roundabout again and exit at the desired street.



- Yield to traffic already in the roundabout
 - Travel in a counterclockwise direction only.
 - SPEED LIMIT 15
Slow down when approaching a roundabout
 - Watch for pedestrians
 - Stay to the right of the splitter island
- 1 Central Island
 - 2 Concrete Truck Apron
 - 3 Pedestrian Refuge
 - 4 Crosswalk
 - 5 Yield Line
 - 6 Splitter Island
 - 7 Circulatory Roadway
 - 8 Sidewalk Around Perimeter
 - 9 Exit Lanes and Entry Lanes

Pedestrians:

- Stay on the designated walkways at all times, crossing only at designated crosswalks.
- Never cross to the central island.
- Watch for cars; you have the right-of-way, but your best protection is your own attention.
- Cross the crosswalk one lane at a time, using the splitter island as a refuge area before crossing the next lane.

Bicyclists:

- If comfortable riding in traffic, you may ride on the circulatory roadway of the roundabout like a car.
- As you approach the roundabout, merge into the entry lane before the shoulder or bike lane ends.
- Communicate your intentions to drivers by pointing to your destination.
- If uncomfortable riding in traffic, dismount your bicycle at the crosswalk and move to the sidewalk. Once on the sidewalk, walk your bicycle like a pedestrian.

Remember that roundabouts are installed to slow traffic safely, and help traffic flow. Always slow as you approach a roundabout, and yield to the traffic within the roundabout for safe travel around Jupiter's roundabouts.



2013 Summer Youth Camp

Summer Camp is designed for children ages 6-13 and covers an 8-week period of the summer break for Palm Beach County Schools. Camp is held at the Jupiter Community Center for four separate age groups (6-7, 8-9, 10-11 and 12-13) and age-appropriate activities are scheduled to provide a fun and exciting summer for your child. Camp activities may include team sports, group games, game room activities, board games, movies, craft projects, cooking projects, guest presentations, off-site field trips and more. Weekly activities are split between both on-site and off-site activities. A typical week at summer camp will include 2 days of all day, off-site field trips; one day of a 1/2 day field trip and 1/2 day at the Community Center; 2 full days at the Community Center.

Mandatory Registration Requirements: The following documents must be presented at the time of registration (NO EXCEPTIONS will be made for these requirements, even if the child has attended previous 2012 or 2013 youth camps):

- Birth certificate for each child: if your child has registered for previous programs at the Community Center, a birth certificate is not required; campers must turn 6 years of age on or prior the last day of camp in order to be eligible; campers may not be older than 13 years old prior to the first day of camp.
- Two (2) forms of proof of incorporated Jupiter residency: this includes Florida driver's license with incorporated Jupiter address AND a 2013 utility, land line phone, cable or tax bill with name and address matching driver's license. Address on license and bill must match and be incorporated Jupiter addresses.

Age Group Placement: All campers will be placed in a specific age group based upon their date of birth (6-7, 8-9, 10-11 or 12-13). Only those campers with birthdays falling within the camp dates who would be eligible to advance to the next age group will have their choice of group placement. If you have a specific request regarding placement with or non-placement with another camper in your child's age group, you will have the opportunity to make that request at the time of registration (maximum 2 campers per request). All efforts will be made to accommodate requests but cannot be guaranteed due to the large number of campers in each age group. Requests will not be granted after May 3, 2013.



POLICE CHIEF'S CORNER

Through my conversations with many of you about public safety related challenges, I have noticed a common theme emerging when it comes to reporting suspicious activities, people, and vehicles. All too often I hear people say that immediately prior to a crime occurring they noticed something out of the ordinary and considered calling the police to report it, however, they ultimately decided not to call simply because they did not want to "bother" us. Consequently, all too often, valuable information that could have prevented a crime from occurring or increased the likelihood of immediate apprehension is lost and the criminals are able to make their escape.

To that end, I am requesting that you do something that I bet you never thought you would hear me ask. My request is simple, when you see something out of the ordinary that could be related to a crime or criminal activity, please "bother" us by reporting that information to us in a timely manner.

You should report suspicious activity whenever you observe it. If it turns out what you observed is something completely innocent, don't worry about it. It is our duty to investigate suspicious activity daily. Never depend on someone else to call if you observe it yourself. If you do, the call might not be made. We would rather have multiple calls about an incident than none at all.

Let us know about events that make you look twice; it may be an opportunity to stop a crime before it occurs. We would much rather respond and check out suspicious activity for legitimacy than respond after a crime has taken place and where a neighbor may be victimized. We value our partnership with the community and together we can make a huge impact on crime and quality of life for all of us.

So, the next time you are deciding whether or not to call the police, please accept my personal invitation to "bother" us! As always, I would like to remind you that we can't do it alone, we need your help. 

Shores Street Resurfacing Project to Begin in January, 2013



On or around the first week of January, 2013, Shores residents will notice a roadway project beginning that will involve roadway milling, asphalt overlay and temporary striping of all Town maintained streets within the Shores. Those streets which will not be included in the project are Longshore Dr., Northfork Dr., and streets within the

private communities of North Fork, Loxahatchee Estates, Cypress Cove, Shorewood and The Preserve. The project is expected to last about 45 days.

The project contract has been awarded to Lawrence-Lynch Corporation for approximately \$750,000. The contract provides for partial-width roadway milling, asphalt overlay and temporary striping. After the pavement cures, the Town will replace the temporary striping with permanent pavement markings. Because asphalt and asphalt prime will inevitably be tracked on to Longshore Drive, the Town will also include the restriping of Longshore Drive in the project (even though it is not a Town-maintained roadway).

The Town inspects roadway pavements on a regular basis to determine the type and severity of pavement distress and deficiencies, and calculates a "Pavement Condition Index," or PCI. The Shores' PCI, considered together with the age of the pavement, showed a need for the resurfacing project, and the funding was identified and approved as part of the Town's Community Investment Program (CIP) in fiscal year 2102-2013.

This type of project is a "once-every-25-year" event, and once construction begins, residents should be patient and use caution. Some lane and temporary closures can be expected during the life of the project, and drivers should use care in crossing the prime/ tack coat as it may cause tracking and discoloration of residents' driveways. Cinquez Park Open Space Restoration Project



In September of 2008, the Town of Jupiter purchased approximately 13 acres of property located on the north side of Indiantown Road at Center Street. The purchase was funded mostly out of the Town's Open Space Program, which is funded by a voter-approved \$16 million bond established to buy and preserve lands in order to mitigate traffic and conserve natural habitats. A portion of the property (approximately 3 acres) was funded by the Town's General Fund.

About 10 of the acres have been designated for natural area restoration, and will be protected from any future development. The first phase of the restoration project is complete, which involves the removal of prohibited and invasive non-native plants. During the clearing process, a significant amount of trash and debris was also removed – enough to fill more than a dozen large dumpsters. This phase has increased visibility through the property making it more viable for wildlife.

The next phase of the project will involve replanting portions of the site with native plant species. The plantings will include over 300 native trees and 1000 native shrubs. The plantings will be installed at the beginning of the rainy season next spring. Volunteer opportunities will be available and will be posted in advance of the planting date on the Town's website.

The remaining 3 acres of the site may be considered as future workforce housing lots. The existing residential lots along Carver Avenue could be considered for homes consistent with the surrounding single-family detached homes, and additional access and connectivity could be created to enhance the neighborhood.

Public Safety Study Underway



In an effort to evaluate the most cost-effective means of delivering services, the Town has contracted for consulting services to develop and evaluate current and alternative means of delivering public safety services. "Public Safety" services include police, fire and emergency medical services.

Currently, the Town manages the delivery of policing services directly through the Jupiter Police Department. However, the Town maintains a contract with Palm Beach County Fire Rescue for fire and emergency medical services. Residents pay for policing through the Town of Jupiter millage rate on their property tax bill (listed under the "Municipality" section of the bill), and pay for fire rescue and medical emergency services through a separate line item on the bill (listed as "Jupiter Fire Rescue" on the bill).

The intention of the study is not to question the quality of the services being delivered by our police officers and fire rescue personnel. Rather, the study is intended to take a closer look at how those services are delivered, and to determine if there are more efficient ways to deliver them while maintaining or improving the quality service.

The Town's consultants from the International City/County Management Association (ICMA) have gathered data to understand the workload facing our public safety personnel and are now in the process of developing a number of options for the Town to consider in collaboration with Palm Beach County Fire Rescue.

This is an important issue for which the Town will ultimately want to hear from the public. Before any decision is made as a result of this study, its findings will be discussed in a series of public forums sometime this spring. New Pedestrian Bridge over Jones Creek at Jupiter River Estates Park Now Open!

Last Spring, the pedestrian bridge connecting the Jupiter River Estates neighborhood to South Pennock Lane near the Aquatic Center was closed for reconstruction. A popular foot-path across Jones Creek, the bridge provides access for students, walkers, and nature-lovers and connects neighborhoods bordered by the waterway.



The Town's Parks & Public Works crews worked to remove the old bridge structure last summer, and built the new structure that was installed this Fall. While the bridge was closed for replacement, the utility lines were refurbished and maintained. The old bridge structure – which had been in place for over 30 years – was replaced with a stronger, more storm-resistant design that will last for years to come.

2013 Matching Grant Program: Your Neighborhood may be eligible to receive a grant!

Applications for the 2013 Town of Jupiter Neighborhood Grant Program will be available the first week of February, 2013 and will be due by March 22, 2013. A workshop to discuss the grant criteria will be held on February 21, 2013 at 6:30 p.m. at the Jupiter Community Center. Communities who send at least one representative to the workshop will receive an additional 10 points towards their application. HOA property managers representing a community will NOT receive the bonus points. Communities that were awarded Matching or Distress Grants within the previous three years (2010-2012) are not eligible to apply in 2013.

Communities will be able to apply for two different grants:

Community Building \$250 - Create, diversify, or increase participation in a community, neighborhood-based association or organization that benefits the neighborhood (communities are allowed to submit applications for this grant along with a neighborhood improvement grant).

Neighborhood Improvement \$1,000-\$5,000 (1 for 1 community match required) - A combination of cash and in-kind support will be accepted. Maximum in-kind contribution will be 50% of the community's portion of the grant. A minimum of 50% financial support is required.
