What Is NENA?

- The Northeast Everglades Natural Area (NENA) is a collection of conservation lands (165,000 acres) as well as activity and education centers lying in northern Palm Beach County and southern Martin County.
- NENA provides residents and visitors with a wide range of nature-based outdoor recreational opportunities.

Historic Jupiter-Indiantown Trail

- 16.5-mile multiuse trail.
- Located between Riverbend Park in Jupiter and the St. Lucie Canal in Indiantown.

Project Benefits

- Restores an old connection between Jupiter in Palm Beach County and Indiantown in Martin County.
- Offers backcountry multi-user access to three conservation lands and visitor facilities: Riverbend Park, Cypress Creek Natural Area, and Jones Hungryland Wildlife and Environmental Area.
- Preserves historic route for future interpretive trail rides.

Project Overview-Phase I

- Historic Jupiter-Indiantown Trail is being built in phases along an old road used from the turn of the century to the late 1950s for travel between Jupiter and Indiantown.
- The trail will accommodate hiking, bicycling, and equestrian activities.
- Phase I of the trail will extend 2 miles from Gulfstream Citrus Road northwest through Palm Beach County's Cypress Creek Natural Area to Mack Dairy Road.
- Five miles of the unimproved roadbed in Martin County off Pratt Whitney Road in Jones Hungryland Wildlife and Environmental Area is open to hikers, cyclists and equestrians.
- Phase I amenities include:
 - ✓ Improved surface for cyclists and hikers
 - ✓ Chickee shade shelter
 - ✓ Horse hitches and bike racks at trailheads in Cypress Creek Natural Area
 - ✓ Informational kiosks and signage
 - ✓ Equestrian pitcher pump well
 - ✓ Access to observation platforms in Cypress Creek Natural Area
- Phase I construction will begin November 29, 2010. The trail will be closed during construction.
